





EVERYONE ATTENDING THE LUNCH MUST WEAR A MASK and BE FULLY VACCINATED and HAVE A WAIVER.


CREEKSIDE 9 HOLE GOLF

Secretary's Report: The minutes of the 2/18/22 BEC Meeting were unanimously approved as emailed and included in the newsletter with a 1st by Leonard Zumstein and 2nd by Bob Holly.

Treasurer's Report: Leonard has completed and emailed Form #28. March report includes a bank balance of \$4057.49 and cash on hand in the amount of \$325.00 for a total of \$4382.49. Our 3/16/22 luncheon produced \$825.00. Dues collected at the meeting totalled \$240. A bill for supplies presented by Larry Hughes in the amount of \$60.34, along with the report, were unanimously approved with a 1st by Bob Holly and 2nd by Bill Stires. \$23.97 for cookies was approved for Greg Back with a 1st by Gary Toombs and 2nd by Fred Courter.

Plenty of Gold in Calaveras Wine Country

Plenty of gold has come back to the Sierra Foothills. In January, the family wineries of Calaveras County held their own in the 2022 San Francisco Chronicle Wine Competition. While all medals are well deserved, it's the Best of Class, Gold and Double Gold awards that really get our attention.

Here are some of the best of the best, out of 5,800 wines from North America. Frog's Tooth Winery brought home 2 Gold Medals. Ironstone Vineyards scored 4 Gold Medals. Milliaire Winery was awarded 2 Double Golds and 1 Gold. Villa Vallecito Vineyards was a Best of Class winner, and won 3 Double Golds and 1 Gold. Vina Moda scored a Best of Class, 3 Double Golds and a Gold. Wowza, that's tons of gold! If you'd like to taste and find out what these winning wines are, just save this special weekend in April.

Enjoy two days of weekend fun in Calaveras Wine Country, April 23-24. Costco originally had the 2020 Lockwood Vineyard Santa Barbara Pinot Noir listed for \$10.99 which is a pretty good deal but with another \$4 off it is even a better. At \$6.99 it is a **steal**. The Mettler Family Vineyards NV Copacetic is a Zinfandel leading red blend that won the Best of Class Award and at \$19.99, it's a **super deal**. The **splurge** this week is the 2019 Santa Maria Valley Sierra Madre Vineyard Pinot Noir from CRU Winery. The SRP is \$50, perfect for a Sunday dinner and a Gold Medal winner in the SF Chronicle Competition. Cheers to all the winners!
