BIG SIR SAYS...

Our gathering for Pizza Lunch last month was very good in some respects but left something to be desired in others. First and foremost, it was good to see people get together again and the pizza from Crust & Crumb was excellent. One of those pizzas was called a "Red Steer" Pizza and



was donated by Stan Maggard, original owner of the Red Steer restaurant and it was tasty. Thank you, Stan! As good as it was to mingle again however some of it was done in a manner that was literally too close for comfort. To insure everyone's safety, which is our priority, we placed chairs at a safe distance with fewer chairs per table but it did not take long for the set-up to be rearranged to in some instances eight per table making social distancing (yes, we are still trying to practice that) next to impossible. We had several areas in which we can improve and we intend to do so when we meet again. Remember that caution is key. We don't want anyone to become infected.

All this brings me to the on again, off again nature of this virus, the CDC's erratic recommendations and in particular

the new and much more dangerous Delta Variant. We can expect these variants to develop and the infections/deaths to continue to rise as long as people elect not to get vaccinated. Infections of vaccinated people (break through infections) are much more common with this mutation than prior variants. While the vaccinated people are still well protected, they can become infected and pass it along to unvaccinated people. Those unvaccinated people who do contract the virus, again possibly from vaccinated people, are much more likely to become more seriously ill and several times more likely to die.

The BEC has opted not to proceed with an in-person gathering on the 18th. We are choosing to err on the side of caution and go back to Zoom meetings for the time being. The Zoom attendance links for the regular meeting on the 18th and the BEC meeting on the 20th are included below. Membership stood at 97 after unpaid members were dropped effective July 21st. We have had a couple pay their dues and are re-joining and we anticipate more shortly. This will pass and we will get back to normal when it is safe to do so.

What's on our Table

I found two Steals this month and both come from the Grocery Outlet. Three Rivers Winery 2015 Columbia Valley Cabernet Sauvignon is a real smooth mature Washington Merlot. It's a \$15 wine, for just \$5.99. The other Steal is the 2019 Dixie & Bass Cabernet Sauvignon Rose'. It's from the Horse Heaven Hills in Washington and it won a Double Gold in the Sunset International Wine Competition. Hands down, it's my favorite "pinkie"to date, just \$3.99 and definitely case worthy. The Ancient Peaks 2017 Renegade is a blend of Syrah, Petite Verdot and Malbec from Paso Robles. It's big, bold and beautiful and also a Silver Medal Winner in the Central Coast Competition. The suggested retail price is \$26 but what makes it a Deal is the price at Costco, just \$15.99. The 40th Anniversary Chardonnay from Sonoma-Cutrer is available online and in select wine shops. It's a Splurge for sure but a one-of a-kind gift for a serious Chardonnay lover or for that special occasion, \$69.99. Cheers!
