BRANCH 143 - SIR EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING Held on - JULY 17, 2022

Treasurer's Report: In Leonard Zumstein's absence, Rock Libby reports a bank checking balance of \$4,191.00 and cash drawer amount of \$275.00 for a total of \$4,466.00. Luncheon receipts for 6/15 were \$1,021, \$46 in raffle split and \$50 from The Greenery for a Newsletter Ad. Total Custodial Receipts were \$1,117. The General Receipts included \$60 in dues and \$17.38 for redeposit of a check that was never cashed for a total \$77.38. The caterer's invoice was \$891, there was \$40 moved from the cash drawer to the checking account and \$275 paid to the Community Center. This represents a total loss of \$89.00 for the luncheon and an Ending Cash Balance of \$4,466.00. The Form 28 was emailed and delivered to the BEC Members at this morning's meeting.

Secretary's Report: The Secretary's minutes of the June BEC Meeting were unanimously approved as emailed. 1st by Larry Hughes and 2nd by Bob Holly

Committee Reports:

Membership: Larry Hughes reports no change with 107 members, 42 of which attended the 7/20 Luncheon. 65 members were absent. In Search of Egyptian Wines ???

The Navigator suggested we visit Egypt. Though not high on my list, she did convince me to travel to India, and Egypt, she said, is so much closer. Ok. We went with a tour company that limits the group size and a guide for the entire trip. We did and saw everything from Cairo to Aswan to Luxor to Abu Simbel and then on to our ship for six nights on the Nile River and finally, Alexandria.

Winemaking has a long tradition in Egypt dating back to the 3rd millennium. The modern wine industry is relatively small. There are only a few Egyptian wines in production. The climate is just too hot and dry to support viticulture on a large scale. The Gianaclis Vineyard planted in 1882 was recently revived and is producing the Omar Khayyam brand. They make a red with Bobal grapes and a white with Sultanine Blanche grapes. Their Rose' is a blend of those two. I rate them as good daily wines. Egyptian beer is very good. Heineken International became owners in 2002.

The Ancient Egypt & Nile River Tour was spectacular and a check- off of the bucket list. It made me realize the Navigator is not the right name for my partner. I think the "Instigator" is more appropriate. Don't you?

Two Freebees

I've been asked many times "Where can I find these local wine events?". Here are two sources:

LocalWineEvents.com is a post it yourself site for wine, food, spirits and beer events. Over 300,000 email subscribers receive THEJUICE, a weekly email that highlights events happening in your local area and it's free. Another good source is www.discovercaliforniawines.com published by the Wine Institute. It covers the six major wine regions in California with maps, winery information and current events and offers. Both sites are excellent for planning a visit to the wine country.

What's on Our Table

I bought three Sauvignon Blancs, each \$4.95 at the Grocery Outlet. Our senior citizen tasting panel gave a unanimous vote to the 2019 Urgency from Lake County, made by Shannon Ridge. Retail price was \$30, a 90 point score plus the six senior votes, sealed the steal. The deal/splurge goes to the 2021 Navarro Rose' of Pinot Noir. It was picked Best of Show Rose', Best of of Class, a Double Gold medal, Best of Mendocino County and received a score of 98 in the Press-Democrat's 2022 North Coast Wine Challenge. The regular price is \$25, the pre-release price until 5/31/22 is \$22 and with a case purchase, the price is \$18, with one cent shipping. Check out the on-line sale. Cheers!


