BEC MINUTES BRANCH 143 - SIR EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING Held on -NOVEMBER 18th, 2022

BEC Minutes Site: My Garden Café, Turlock Meeting called to order at 8:04 AM

Secretary's Report: Secretary Rock Libby's report consisting of the October minutes was unanimously approved with a 1st by Ed Darrah and 2nd by Joe Adams.

Treasurer's Report: Leonard Zumstein reports a bank balance of \$3489.84 and petty cash in the amount of \$275 for a total of \$3764,84. Our October monthly luncheon receipts were \$1940. Expenses of \$2105.43 for catering and \$275 Hall rental and set-up for a total of \$2380.43. This month's luncheon loss totaled \$435.43. Other expenses included: Postage \$96.00 and Supplies \$26.96 for a total \$122.96. There were reimbursements for supplies in the amount of \$86.76 to Greg Back, \$7.30 to Bob Holly and \$16.98 to Larry Hughes. These reimbursements were approved unanimously with a 1st by Gary Toombs and 2nd by Fred Courter. The Treasurer's report including the Form 28 was approved unanimously with a 1st by Kevin Byrne and 2nd by Bob Holly.

Membership: Larry Hughes' report Indicates total attendance at our November luncheon was 50. We received one new application from our guest, Brent Bohlender. His membership was approved unanimously with a 1st by Rock Libby and 2nd by Bob Holly. This approval brings our membership to 116, exceeding our goal of 113 for the year. The membership report and accompanying form 27 was unanimously approved with a 1st by Bob Holly and 2nd by Ed Darrah. On a side note, Larry Hughes has agreed to remain in the position of Membership Chairman indefinitely. Dine In/Dine Out: Gary Toombs: There are no activities scheduled for November or December. We expect to Dine Out in January and have a Wine Tasting with our resident Wine Guru, Russ Winton in February. There is consideration of rotating these two activities on a monthly basis. Travel: Bill Stires notes there were slots for the Ireland Trip that opened up due to cancellation and filled immediately. Fall colors trip for October 2023 is set with cost of airfare unavailable until December. New member John Cardoza is

in line to take over for Bill as Travel Chairman. Bill will be taking John to the various chapters he serves and introduce him to all our travelers. Our appreciation to Bill for past service and welcome to John.

Old Business: Kevin Byrne visited Carl Grubb and Leonard Zumstein visited Brad Sleeper to deliver their Senior HLM awards. There was a motion to move Brad Sleeper to HLM Emeritus status and Joe Adams was nominated by State President Rick Kindle for Honorary Life Member status. A motion was passed unanimously for both these actions with a 1st by Bob Holly and 2nd by Ed Darrah. Greg Back will complete and submit the SIR Form for Joe's HLM status. Brad Sleeper is at Cougar, formerly Paramount Park, and would appreciate any visitation. There was discussion of selling tickets at our luncheons for the following month's luncheon beginning in January in order to get a more accurate count for our caterer.

New Business: There was discussion of our upcoming Ladies Day/Christmas Luncheon. Notice of the luncheon will be sent out to the membership via Constant Contact by Greg Beck. Rock Libby will be coordinating with the Caterer and expects to provide final numbers by the preceding Friday. Rick Kindle will pick up 15 Poinsettias from Duarte Nursery. Our Speaker for the Month of December UC Merced Chancellor Dr. Juan Munoz

The program for December will be UC Merced Chancellor Dr. Juan Munoz. Dr. Munoz took office as the fourth permanent chancellor of UC Merced on July 1, 2020, and is the first graduate of the University of California to lead the campus. UC Merced originated in 1988 in a decision by the UC Board of Regents. After a review of sites, Merced was chosen in 1995. Its first graduate courses began in the fall of 2004, and the undergraduate courses started in September 2005. UC Merced has grown to be one of the largest employers in Merced County and contributes about \$1.7 billion annually to the San Joaquin Valley. Enrollment is close to 9,000 students. THE WINE LINE

Wine Tasting Made Simple

See it, swirl it, smell it, sip it, swallow or spit it and summarize it are the six basic steps in tasting wine. Most people have problems identifying the aromas, also called descriptors, and that's because they just sip and swallow. They never slosh it or chew it or gargle it or work it to assist their nose in smelling it. Try it. Take a sip and swallow. Now do the same, but this time slosh it or chew it, working it to the back of your mouth by taking deep breaths and completely coating your mouth. Then after you swallow, breathe through your mouth and exhale through your nose several times. "Oh Wow!" is the comment I usually hear from first time tasters and this is why "Sloshing it" is step #5 in my 7 basic steps in tasting wine.

Sweetness, acidity, tannin and alcohol all come into play when you like or dislike a wine. For example, is the wine sweet or dry? What do you prefer? Does the wine have too much acidity or not enough? Does your mouth salivate and tingle? It's your palate, is it too much or not enough? How astringent (mouth drying) or bitter is the wine? Too much tannin creates a furry teeth feel. But are moderate levels OK? If you feel a hot burning sensation in the back of your throat that's way too much alcohol and probably a turnoff. If you taste and find any of these four components are out of whack, you can just say No. You can say with full authority something like, " The wine was way too acidic for me and I just gleeked on my best friend." Sweetness, acidity, tannin and alcohol all have to be in balance in a good wine. Add to that a full body and long flavored finish, you can have a great wine. Remember just trust your palate, it's always your call. Have fun and don't forget to "slosh it."

What's On Our Table

Here are three wines for your consideration. The "G" or **Grazie Mille by the Francis Ford Coppola Winery** is a rich red blend, perfect for pizza and just \$5.99 at the Grocery Outlet. The **2020 Veramonte Carmenere** organic wine from Chile is rich and velvety. You'll think it's Merlot as did the Chileans until the mid 90's when it was identified as Carmenere. The price is \$10.99 at most markets. The **Quivira Vineyards 2019 Dry Creek Zinfandel** is a plush, well balanced wine. With red raspberry/cherry flavors, it's a **Zin lovers delight**. The SRP is \$28 and it is sale priced a few dollars less. **That's it, a steal, a deal and an excellent splurge, enjoy. Cheers!**
