BRANCH 143 - SIR EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING Held on - JANUARY 21, 2022

BEC Meeting Agenda

Call to Order: 8:02 AM

Site My Garden Café: Quorum is present:

Guest: Rick Kindle, SIR State President

Attendance: Greg Back, Rock Libby, Fred Courter, Leonard Zumstein, Gary Toombs, Kevin Byrne, Joe Adams, Bob Holly, Larry Hughes, Bill Stires and Ed Darrah.

Treasurer's Report: Leonard Zumstein reports a bank checking balance of \$4853,78 and cash in the amount of \$325 for a total of \$5178.78. At our 1/19/22 luncheon we had \$988 in meal collections. The caterer invoice for the lunch was \$977. We collected 19 Member dues leaving us with 72 paid and 40 unpaid members to date. The form 28 was emailed and delivered to the BEC members this morning. The Treasurer's report does not require a motion to be accepted according to Big Sir Greg Back.

Secretary's Report: The Secretary's minutes were unanimously approved as emailed in December by Secretary Ken Edwards with a 1st by Gary Toombs and 2nd by Bob Holly.

Committee Reports:

Membership Report: Membership Chair Larry Hughes reports we have 110 members. Former members Andy Kahler, Manuel Drumonde and John Robnik resigned in opposition to SIR State Covid 19 protocols. Of the 29 members dropped effective July 24th 2021 for failure to pay dues, 15 have paid their dues and been reinstated.

Nominating Committee Report: Committee Chair Rock Libby named Ed Darrah, Bob Holly, Joe Adams, Gary Toombs and Kevin Byrne to the committee. This committee will meet on a Friday in February at a date and location to be determined. We need to fill the positions of Big Sir, Little Sir, Secretary, Assistant Secretary and Assistant Treasurer. We need participation from more members in filling these positions.

Golf report: Joe Adams: Joe reports golfers are participating at about 40% of the number prior to Covid. Joe reported a successful turnout for the Ron Witort Memorial Tournament at Atwater. Ron was a member who passed last year and enjoyed his SIR Golf. This may turn out to be an annual event.

Dine in/DineOut: Chairman Gary Toombs reports there is nothing new to report on Dine In/Dine Out as it is difficult to find a location to host the number we anticipate while providing separate checks.

Bocci Ball: Michael Johnson will be assuming the Chairmanship for Bocci Ball. Expect to hear more from him soon.

Travel: Bill Stires eloquently stated that travel is "status quo".

Old Business: There was discussion of our Phone Tree system. The script will be revised and is to be followed verbatim in order to handle the problem of lunches ordered and not paid for if the member who ordered lunch fails to show. The lunch cost is \$20 and the chapter cannot afford to pay for no-shows. A valid excuse such as an emergency will suffice and we will make the effort to sell unclaimed lunches but if we can't, payment for that lunch will be due at the next meeting. Phone tree messages left by our callers must stress the answer to the message goes to either the caller or Bob Holly and not Big Sir Greg Back.

New Business: Leonard Zumstein will be contacting Mark Taylor and Marvin Souza regarding their participation on the Audit Committee. Greg Back went over the proposed budget for the coming year and there will be further review in the coming months. There was a motion to reimburse Greg Back for supplies in the amount of \$39.70 with 1st by Gary Toombs and 2nd by Ed Darrah. Approval was unanimous. Additionally, there was a motion to reimburse Rick Kindle for an "A Frame" and inserts for same in the amount of \$146.14. The motion passed unanimously with a 1st by Larry Hughes and 2nd by Bill Stires. President Rick is making efforts to increase the Statewide membership in SIR which is down considerably over the last few years. To that end, there are plans for Television, Newspaper press releases and newsletters to be employed in order to overcome our lack of visibility. To assist with that Rick requested approval for the order of 1,000 brochures with a cost of \$390. That approval was unanimous with a 1st by Bob Holly and 2nd by Leonard Zumstein.

WINE TASTING

Wine Investigation for Novices and Oenophiles (W.I.N.O.)

Don't Outsource Your Palate

Alexis Lichine (1913-1989) was a Russian wine writer and entrepreneur. He played a key role in promoting varietal labelling of New World wines. He was the wine buyer for the Waldorf Astoria in New York and later, export manager for Chateau Haut-Brion. He purchased Chateau Prieure-Lichine, was an expert taster in the New York Wine Tasting of 1973 and was chosen 1987 "Man of the Year" by Decanter Magazine.

In 1986, he wrote in Wine Country Magazine, how the industry's elitist attitudes were turning consumers away from wine. I loved that article and I saved it. Here are some of his quotes that have stayed with me for 35 years. He said.."We mustn't make a cult of wine. Some of our self-appointed wine snobs with their pomposity have done more to hurt the cause of wine than anything I can think of. I've tried to dispel the layman's fears. Drink the wine you like best, I tell them. Trust your palate. Never mind the so-called experts. And, very important, never mind those people—some wine writers, for example—who try to intimidate by talking about pH and brix and yeast strains and fermentation temperatures and never get around to talking about how they like the wine. The selection of a wine is a personal choice. You shouldn't be influenced by what other people say. If it

tastes good to you, then drink it. Enjoy it. Learn to trust your palate and to heck with the wine snobs."

Thank you Mr. Lichine. What he said in 1986 still rings true today. Even with the popular 100 point ratings, you're still outsourcing your palate to someone you don't even know. Does it surprise you to see so many 90 point wines in the market place? Forget the points and just trust your palate. It's simple, find a wine you like, one you can afford, drink it and enjoy it. Cheers!

This week's Steal is the 2020 Domaine De Cassaigne from the Cotes De Gascogne region in France. It's 60% Colombard and 40% Gras Manseng. If you like acidic whites, this one will really make you gleek. It's \$5 at the Grocery Outlet. The best Deal is the 2019 La Sonriente Garnacha from the Catatyud in Spain. It is medium bodied with cherry flavors, a smooth finish and under \$8.00 at Trader Joe's. The Splurge buy of the week is the 2019 Margerum M5 from Santa Barbera County. It's a Rhone GSM blend with the addition of Counoise and Cinsaut. The SRP is \$30 and Costco's price is \$19.98. Why is \$19.98 a splurge? Because I bought 3 bottles. Cheers! Comments? 
