



Meeting called to order at 8:21 AM

Officers present: Dan Gorman, Ken Gomes, Rock Libby, Leonard Zumstein, Roger Jackson, Bob Holly, Fred Courier, Mike Johnson, Al Kosters and Ken Kajioka.

Guests: None

Quorum: Secretary Rock Libby reported that a quorum is present.

Secretary Report:

A motion to approve the Minutes from the last BEC Meeting as emailed by Greg Back and published in the newsletter was made by Bob Holly. The motion received a 1st by Leonard Zumstein and 2nd by Roger Jackson. The motion passed.

Treasurer's Report:

Leonard Zumstein reported that the Quarterly Assessment of \$285 representing 83 members was paid. The Form 29 has been completed and submitted. The report indicates:

Checkbook balance \$4,298.83

Savings \$0

Petty Cash \$ 275.00

Total Cash \$4,573.83

Receipts include \$ 680.00 Dues

Disbursements include \$1,440 in Special Activities (Ladies Luncheon at Covenant Village) Receipts presented at the meeting for payment included \$47.24 by Al Kosters for postage and \$23.63 for Newsletter printing by Fred Courier. A motion to approve the report was made by Ken Gomes with a first by Bob Holly and second by Roger Jackson. The motion was passed.

Membership Report: Mike Johnson reports we currently have 86 Members. Attendance at our Wednesday (1/21) Meeting included 35 Members, 3 Guests and one Speaker, total 39. We had no inductions and received applications for Ray Reed and Tony Bianchi. Those applications were approved with a motion by Bob Holly, a 1st by Leonard Zumstein and 2nd by Roger Jackson. This brings our membership count to 88.

Activity Reports:

Bocce Ball: Mike Johnson reports a normal turnout of 8 members and recently as many as 12. A good time is generally had by all. Ken Kajioka suggests that prospective members attend Bocce Ball or some other activity prior to submitting their applications to give them an idea of how our activities might appeal to them.

Golf: Ken Kajioka reports Golfers are playing in the fog.

RV: Roger Jackson reports he has 17 Rigs heading to Jackson Rancheria on his next outing and an additional 10 couples without RVs will be staying at the Casino. Dining run into a snag with these numbers attending in that there is no available seating for that many diners. The solution from the restaurant is to divide the group into 3 separate seatings at 4:00, 4:30 or 5:00. This is a less than desirable arrangement so the search is on for another venue.

Travel: Ken Kajioka discussed the trip to Sierra Repertory Theater on March 19th will feature Fiddler on the Roof with seats at \$32 for the 2:00 PM performance.

More Travel: Travel Chairman John Cardoza was absent but the October 2026 Hawaiian Cruise out of San Francisco is on with cabins available.

Dine Out: Gary Toombs was absent but our evening at First & Main on January 29th is on and looks to be a great time as are all our Dine Outs.

Recruitment: Chairman Rick Kindle was absent due to Knee Ops. There was discussion about dues collection and the suggestion that the late payers be approached by their sponsors.

Old Business: The Schedule of Branch Operations was discussed along with the schedule of 2026 Presenters recently sent out by Roger Jackson. The Evening at Castle Noz was discussed along with the menu, catered by Neto's, serving of alcohol to avoid legal issues, the Band at \$600, and clean up committee. A motion to approve by Roger Jackson with 1st by Ken Kajioka and 2nd by Leonard Zumstein was approved. A motion to increase in the price of Castle Noz from \$45 to \$50 was made by Rock Libby and approved with a 1st by Leonard Zumstein and 2nd by Bob Holly.

New Business: Approval of the Fiddler on the Roof trip was made with a motion by Bob Holly, a 1st by Leonard Zumstein and 2nd by Ken Kajioka. A discussion re: Future December Ladies Day Roger Jackson moved that we consider Carnegie Arts Center and Samaritan Village. The motion had a 1st by Mike Johnson and 2nd by Bob Holly. Motion passed.
