








Our Speaker for the month of FEBRUARY Will Be Michael Lella



In 1943, Pino Lella was a 17-year-old living in Milan at the height of the British bombardment of the city. In order to protect him, his parents sent him to Casa Alpina, a boy's school in the Alps, where he trained to be an Alpine climber and ultimately became the escort of countless Jewish refugees seeking escape over the Alps into Switzerland. At age 18, he had to join the military and his family strongly persuaded him to join the German army, where he became the



personal driver and confidant of Hans Leyers, a Nazi General, and ultimately became a spy for the Allies. Besides being an epic tale of one young man's incredible courage and resilience during one of history's darkest hours, it is also a beautiful, but tragic, love story.

Pino's son, Michael Lella, will share the story of his father and his role in the forgotten Italian front of WWII. He will provide great dimension and background to the story, covering some of the facts and unknown details about his father's life. There is a short Q & A following Michael Lella's presentation.



Chronicle Tasting) Trader Moon' 2018 (read Delicato) Honey Moon Viognier for \$5.99. The best Merlot under \$15 was the Purple Moon Merlot 2018 for \$3.99! Why can't Turlock have a Trader Joe's? I always stop at TJ's whenever possible.

I've been cruising the wine aisles for almost 50 years. I look for wines with good value and within my price range. In other words, I find a wine that I like, one I can afford and then I enjoy it. Here were my "go to" bargain daily wines in 2019.






