WINE TASTING - Russ Winton Wine Investigation for Novices and Oenophiles (W.I.N.O.)

Here are my wine picks from my July 8 'Wine Line'

The Steal: The 2018 Mezzacorona Pinot Grigio from Trentino, Italy always scores 88-89 points and retails for \$11. Trader Joe's has it for just \$6.99. If you dig Pinot Grigios, load up!

The Deal: Looking for an easy drinking Cabernet Sauvignon at a decent price? Find the 2018 Imagery, yes, the bottle with the unique label in your local market. The SRP is \$20, but less with dis-

counts for under \$17 and that's really good deal. The Splurge: Red blends your thing? Look for 'The Spur' from Murrieta's Well Winery in Livermore. The 2016 blend is dark and delicious with 35% Cabernet Sauvignon, 27% Merlot, 22% Petite Sirah, 9% Petit Verdot, 4% Cabernet Franc, and 3% Malbec. The SRP is \$35 but Costco price is under \$28, and of course, I should have bought more. Cheers!

Independence Day, the Fourth of July, is an important day in our nation's history. Here are some fun facts about this great national holiday.

1. The Declaration of Independence wasn't signed on July 4 (or in July at all). Only John Hancock actually signed the Declaration of Independence on July 4,

1776. The remainder signed on August 2.

- 2. The first Independence Day celebration took place in Philadelphia on July 8, 1776. This was also the day that the Declaration of Independence was first read in public after people were summoned by the ringing of the Liberty Bell.
- 3. Benjamin Franklin proposed the turkey as the national bird but was overruled by John Adams and Thomas Jefferson, who recommended the bald eagle.
- 4. Every 4th of July the Liberty Bell in Philadelphia is tapped (not actually rung) thirteen times in honor of the original thirteen colonies.
- 5. Eating salmon on the Fourth of July is a tradition in New England.
- 6. Massachusetts was the first state to recognize the Fourth of July.
- 7. The oldest annual Fourth of July celebration is held in Bristol, Rhode Island.
- 8. The shortest Fourth of July parade is in Aptos, California.
- 9. There are around 15,000 Independence Day fireworks celebrations every year.
- 10. Americans eat an estimated 150 million hot dogs on the Fourth of July. If laid end to end, that would stretch from Los Angeles to New York and back 5 times.
- 11. Americans spent \$6.7 billion on food last year to celebrate the Fourth of July.
- 12. Three presidents have died (Thomas Jefferson, John Adams, James Monroe), and one was born (Calvin Coolidge), on the Fourth of July.






