BRANCH 143 - SIR EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING Held on - MAY 20, 2022

Call to Order: 8:01 AM Site: My Garden Café Quorum is present:

Treasurer's Report: Leonard Zumstein reports a Bank Balance of \$4,388.34 and cash drawer amount of \$320 for a total of \$4,708.34. We collected \$90 in dues and \$1,190 lunch receipts at our Wednesday luncheon. Expenses were \$886 to Slick Fork, \$275 Hall rental and \$50.79 to Mike Fulz for supplies totaling \$1,211.79. A net loss of \$21.79 for the lunch. The report was unanimously approved with a 1st by Larry Hughes and 2nd by Gary Toombs.

Secretary's Report: The Secretary's minutes were unanimously approved as emailed and included in the newsletter. 1st by Bob Holly and 2nd by Joe Adams.

Committee Reports:

Membership Report: Chairman Larry Hughes reports membership at 106 per the May Form 27 with 56 attending the 5/18 luncheon and 48 absent. A motion to reinstate Mike Reed and Charlie Crivelli was passed with a 1st by Leonard Zumstein and 2nd by Joe Adams

Nominating Committee Report: Committee Chair Rock Libby reports we need only fill the positions of Big Sir and one Board Member. Any takers?

Phone Tree: We had 63 RSVPs and 52 members attending. Those who confirmed they would be there for lunch and did not show will be billed the \$20.00 lunch cost to which they committed.

Golf report Joe Adams: Joe reports Golf is off about 50% in participation. Other than that, no news. Things are moving along.

Dine in/Dine Out: Chairman Gary Toombs is hard at work in search of facilities to accommodate our group. He is currently looking at Great American Grill in Hilmar and Crostini's in Turlock. Crostini's is a promising possibility for our monthly luncheon as well

Bocci Ball: Chairman Mike Johnson was absent but we expect that activity to kick off very soon. If the Dust Bowl courts are unavailable due to their new hours of operation we may rely on "Generous Gary Toombs" and utilize his back yard court.

Travel: Bill Stires was absent but provided information for two upcoming trips for next year. The first, Scenic Ireland scheduled for 4/14-27/23 and the second, Fall Colors, 10/15-22/23. These trips were unanimously approved with a 1st by Leonard Zumstein and 2nd by Ed Darrah

Walking Group: Rock Libby reports the group is now up to eight walkers and we will soon decide where and when to hold our first walk/stroll/amble.

Pool & Billiards: This new activity will be headed up by Ken Kajioka and will take place at Sharkey's Billiards. Schedule to be determined. The activity was approved unanimously with a 1st by Joe Adams and 2nd by Ed Darrah.

New Business: There was discussion of a long-standing issue with one particular member consistently eating yet failing to pay for his lunch. This problem goes back four or more years. The BEC approved the sending of a letter requiring him to address these items or be disallowed entrance to future lunch meetings and other indoor activities. This action was approved with a 1st by Larry Hughes and 2nd by Bob Holly. State President Rick Kindle reports at the State Executive Meeting a motion was passed to discontinue the required signing of Covid Waivers. As of now our Branch still requires these waivers.

If You Grow it, They Will Come

One of my favorite family owned wineries is Balletto Vineyards. Their Pinot Noirs are incredible and so is their story. Here's a brief summary. In 1977, John Balletto graduates high school and in the same year, his father dies. He decides to pass on a collegiate athletic scholarship and stay home to help his mother on their five acre vegetable farm. Three years later, a big supermarket chain asks him to be their vegetable supplier. In 1981, John buys his first property. This expansion phase continues into the early 90's making Balletto Farms was the largest vegetable farm in Northern California, growing 70 different vegetables on 700 acres. The water damage of three El Nino Storms and the NAFTA Agreement in the 90's created challenges for vegetable farmers. In 1999, John decided it was time to turn his 700 acres into estate vineyards.

Balletto Vineyard's first vintage was in 2001 with 391 cases of Chardonnay and 689 cases of Pinot Noir. Today, production is about 25,000 cases of estate wines using just the top 10% of their harvest. The rest is sold to well known Sonoma wineries who recognize the quality of Balletto fruit. Consumers also become aware of his award winning wines made under the direction of winemaker, Anthony Beckman. John Balletto's success in growing vegetables or grapes or producing wine, would not be complete without mentioning the continuing help and support of his wife, Terri, and their two daughters.

Field of Dreams

In 2002, Balletto workers asked their boss if he would support their Mexican-American baseball team. John said yes. He would supply the equipment and materials if they would supply the labor. He surprised the workers by tearing out 4 acres of Chardonnay, Pinot Gris and Pinot Noir right behind the winery. One year later, Los Uveros (the Grapers), had their own regulation sized baseball field, one of the best kept in Sonoma County. Every Sunday the field of dreams is packed with families big and small. Cheers to Balletto Vineyards!

What's on Our Table

The **Steal** this week is the 2019 Coppola Cabernet Sauvignon. It's an easy drinking house red for just \$5.99 at the Grocery Outlet. The **Deal** is the 2019 g3 Red Blend from Goose Ridge Vineyard in Washington. The SRP is \$15. It is sale priced around \$12 and available at most markets. The **Splurge** (\$27) goes to Casto Oaks Winery in Mariposa. The 2015 Cabernet Sauvignon Red Blend, called Man's Best Friend is a Gold Medal winner in the SF Chronicle Tasting. A day trip to the Casto Oaks tasting room followed by a lunch would be a perfect reason to take a Friday off. Cheers!


