# BRANCH 143 - SIR EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING Held on - APRIL 22, 2022

**Treasurer's Repor**t: Leonard Zumstein reports a bank checking balance of \$4,373.78 and cash drawer amount of \$325 for a total of \$4,698.78. We collected \$240 in dues and \$1,200 lunch receipts at our Wednesday luncheon. Expenses were \$1,004.40 to Slick Fork for lunch, \$275 hall rental and \$28.54 for supplies totaling \$1366.08. A net loss of \$166.08 for the lunch. Per Big Sir Greg Back via Little Sir Gary Toombs there is no need for a motion to approve the Treasurer's report.

Larry Hughes was reimbursed \$86.54 for luncheon supplies and stamps. The motion was approved with a 1st by Joe Adams and 2nd by Ed Darrah.

**Secretary's Report:** The Secretary's minutes were unanimously approved as emailed and included in the newsletter. 1st by Bob Holly and 2nd by Larry Hughes

#### **Committee Reports:**

**Membership Report:** Chairman Larry Hughes reports membership at 104 per the Form 27 with half or 52 attending the 4/20 luncheon and 52 absent. A motion to reinstate Ed Friedberg and Sam Pulido was passed with a 1st by Ed Darrah and 2nd by Joe Adams. Ed Heaton, voted in as a member at our last BEC Meeting withdrew his membership at the luncheon.

Nominating Committee Report: Committee Chair Rock Libby named Ed Darrah, Bob Holly, Joe Adams, Gary Toombs and Kevin Byrne to the committee. This morning's meeting resulted in Vern Segars taking the Assistant Treasurer position and Rock Libby agreeing to take the Assistant Secretary position. This leaves us with one Director position and that of Big Sir to fill our slate of Officers and Directors. The committee will meet next month and hopefully complete our task. Mike Fultz will take over the responsibility for setting up the hall and purchasing of luncheon supplies from Larry Hughes.

**Phone Tree:** Greg Back will handle calls for Bob Holly next month. We are hard at work trying to simplify this process for Bob since he is assuming the position of Little Sir.

Golf report Joe Adams: Joe reports Golf is, like most things, off

about 50% in participation. There is a Team Qualifier Tournament in May.

**Dine in/Dine Out:** Chairman Gary Toombs reports attendance at Toscana's last month was 28. This month we dine at Olive Garden on 4/28 and at present have 27 attending. Thanks to his lovely wife Mary as well.

**Walking Group:** Rock Libby reports the group is off to a rather slow start after initially being greeted with enthusiasm. We will give it a bit more time.

**Old Business:** We discussed the need for a Golf Chairman to replace Joe Adams. If no one steps up to assume that position there will be no more golf as an activity for our Branch. For that matter, if we cannot locate some one to take the Big Sir position, we may be closing the entire Branch. We desperately need someone in the position. Help!

# A Perfect Day at Las Positas Winery

The Navigator said we needed to escape. I agreed. Our cats, Ernesto and Julio, think we are just door monitors. We let cat in, let cat out, let cat in, starting at 5:00 AM! So off we went to Livermore Valley to taste the wines of Las Positas Vineyards. The winery hit a grand-slam of sorts in the 2022 SF Chronicle Wine Competition. Las Positas won 5 Double Gold Medals of which 3 became Best of Class winners and 9 Gold Medals. Wowza!

Las Positas Vineyards is a family winery that produces small lots of estate grown wines from a 20 acre vineyard. The winemaker is Brent Amos, a graduate from Fresno State University (Go Bulldogs!), with a degree in Oenology and Viticulture. He was winemaker at Livermore's Fenestra Winery for seven years before taking on and guiding Las Positas' successful run.

The 5 Double Gold wines were the '21 Verdelho,' the '19 Reserve Barbera, the '19 Syrah, the '18 Garnacha and the'19 Garnacha. For the 9 Gold Medal winning wines, go to **www.winejudging.com**. Make sure you also check out their 12 Silver Medal winners. This is quite an accomplishment for a winery whose total production is just 3,000

cases.

The tasting is \$20 with five generous pours, all carried to the table in a wrought iron glass holder. The servers are very knowledgeable and helpful. We tasted a Sparkling wine, the Estate Rose', the 2019 Estate Monastrell, the '18 Estate Tempranillo and Conspiritus IV. I suggest you order a charcuterie plate (\$15) and the featured flatbreads (\$17). Ours delicious flatbread was a Caprese Mozzarella. Desserts are also available (\$15). The \$20 tasting fee is waived with a two bottle purchase.

Las Positas is a place where you can slow down, take in the views and soak up the sunshine, sip and appreciate award winning wines and nibble and savor the excellent food. After our wonderful escape day, unfortunately, we headed home and resumed our daily ritual of let cat in, let cat out, let cat in, let cat out.................
