BRANCH 143 - SIR EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING Held on -SEPTEMBER 23, 2022

Meeting called to order at 8:01 AM

Secretary's Report: The report, as emailed and presented in the newsletter, was passed unanimously with a 1st by Joe Adams and 2nd by Bob Holly

Treasurer's Report: Leonard Zumstein reports an August expenditure of \$16 for our guest speaker lunch and a rebate of \$20 from Bob Holly for unused supplies for a net \$4 positive gain. The current bank balance is \$4215, and the Cash drawer total of \$295 = a total balance of \$4510. Reimbursement of \$50 to Larry Hughes was unanimously approved with a 1st by Ed Darrah and 2nd by Bob Holly. Reimbursement of \$15 for Leonard's 9/21 guest speaker lunch was approved, with 1st by Ed Darrah and 2nd by Rock Libby.

Membership Report: Larry Hughes reports our 9/21 luncheon had 44 members present, three guests, and our speaker for a total of 48 attendees. We received applications for membership from two of our guests, Richard Cross and John Cardoza. Both were unanimously approved with a 1st by Gary Toombs and 2nd by Ed Darrah. In addition, there was a motion to make dues for new members paid after September credited to the following year. The motion passed unanimously with a 1st by Rock Libby and 2nd by Bob Holly.

Tuskegee daughters to speak in Turlock & Denair SIR #143

Turlock will be honoring the Tuskegee Airmen on October 18 th and 19 th . The daughters of Spanky Johnson will be providing informative presentations to the Turlock Rotary Clubs and the Turlock SIR Branch 143. Leigh Roberts and Michalyn Green will be making the presentation to honor the very famous first all-Black 99 th Fighter Squadron in World War II. The Ladies are from the Tuskegee Airmen Heritage Chapter of Greater Sacramento. Their Father was Colonel George S. "Spanky Roberts", the first Commanding Officer of the 99th in June of 1942. There was a movie about this Squadron, the "Red Tails," that flew the mighty P-51 Fighter as an escort with bombers flying into Germanoccupied countries. Bomber squadrons were known to request the Red Tails as an escort because they always protected their flights.

Central Coast Wine Competition Results

The California Mid-State Fair has released the winners of the 20th Annual Central Coast Wine Competition (CCWC). This year's event included 95 wineries with 572 wines entered. The blind tasting was held at the Paso Robles Event Center.

Here are the Best of Show winners. Red: Riboli Family Wines Paso Robles 2019 San Simeon Cabernet Sauvignon. White: Midnight Cellars, Paso Robles 2021 Aurora Reserve. Dessert: Halter Ranch, Paso Robles 2019 Vin De Paille. Rose': Cass Winery, Paso Robles 2022 Oasis. Sparkling: Vintage Wine Estates, Arroyo Grande Laetitia Brut Rose'.

The CCWC named Pear Valley Vineyards as the 2022 Winery of the Year. The Paso Robles winery had 22 entries with 2 Best of Class, 3 double golds and 9 golds. This is the second Winery of the Year honor for Pear Valley. For a complete list of winners go to

Napa Valley Tastings Fees Rise

Esther Mobely, Senior Wine Critic for the San Francisco Chronicle, recently reported that Napa Valley basic tasting fees have doubled in the last six years. In 2016, the average was \$20. Today, a basic tasting of 5-6 tastes is now \$40.82. The elevated or reserve tasting, which might include food pairings or only tasting exclusive reserve wines,

was \$30 in 2016. Today it is averaging \$82.26.

Increased costs due to inflation, labor shortages, wild-fires (fire insurance), supply chain disruptions and farming costs are being passed on to consumers. Even with these increased fees, wineries reported that business is not slowing down but actually increasing. This might be due to the exclusive one-on-one private table service and the ease of advanced reservations. The report concludes that small wineries have modestly raised their basic fees in the \$5-\$10 range. If you need a Napa fix, my advice is to go online, find out what is being offered, if reservations are required and the cost. Napa Valley attracts 4 million tourists yearly and a day in Napa Valley is still an awesome experience.

What's on our Table

How many 100+ degrees days have we had this summer? How many nights did those Delta breezes let us down and the AC ran all night? To maintain our coolness and our sanity, we look for light crisp white wines and chilled dry roses'. The Alma de Cattleya wines from Sonoma County met our needs. Alma means "soul" in Spanish and Cattleya is the national flower of Columbia, which is the native country of owner/winemaker, Bibiana Gonzalez Rave. Her 2021 Sauvignon Blanc and the 2021 Rose' of Pinot Noir helped us win the battle. Both are a deal, sale priced under \$20. The Alma de Cattleya label is beautiful and so are her wines. 
