GOLFERS CORNER

The biggest tournament of the year for SIR 159 golf (and perhaps all of Fresno SIR golf) is the RON RICH MEMORIAL TOURNAMENT. For those of you who don't know Ron Rich was instrumental in getting SIR golf started being played at the many different courses as we know it to be today The tournament begins June 13th and is a

match play event in flights with winners advancing to the end when the champion will be determined across the remaining 4 flights. This tournament is open to all Fresno SIR golfers and you are allowed two weeks to play your match with your opponent. The details and prizes are too much to show here, but they are available on the 159 website or from 159 golf chairman Mike Moyle. There is no cost to participate and vour matches can be played during the regular 159 SIR tournaments if you are playing in the tournament where your ball is scored.

The first tournament in May was held at Belmont in flights only (58 players signed up); no novelty tournaments are played for the first outing each month. Ted Fox stole the day with 1st place in Flight # 1 with a net of 65 (white Tees), CTP on hole #2, and 2nd place CTP on hole #11. Low net for the day and winner in flight 2 went to Dave Barredo with a 64 from the gold. Dell Kerns and David Bourbon each had net 67 in flight 3 from the gold. And Joe Marshall took flight 4 with a net 67 from the gold. Eighteen players had nets below par.

Thirty-three went up the hill to play at Sierra Meadows. Some car pooled and others took advantage of the bus for \$5 and saved money on gas and wear and tear on the car and mind with the mountain driving. Jim Whitmer won CTP on #8 and Rich Zanarini won on #17. We had only 9 players in the novelty game (Shambles) and 24 in the 4man2BB. At times the novelty tournaments seem to get to have so few players, it seems like it might be better if we only have

one event that day like we have in the first tournament of the month.

Week 3 found us a little closer to home and we had 49 show-up at Madera Muni for an 8AM start. There were several no shows which causes problems for the monthly chairman in setting up the groups. Gary Smith was CTP on #6 and Mike Fair took the honor on #15. The Scrambles event was won by the team of Danny Munoz, Charlie Ratliff, Dave Betts, and Tom Topjian. In the 2manBB game, we had Perry Huffman and Dennis Ensminger team up with a BB of 53. They ham-and-egged good enough together, to beat the nearest competitors (Gary Smith and Ray Phillips) by 3 strokes. 19 under beats 16 under every time.

The SIR State Scramble qualifier will be held at Riverbend on June 21 for Area 29. See Area Chairman Butch Evans for rules to set up a team or if you are interested in playing but need help in forming a team. This qualifier is open to all Fresno groups and the teams can be formed from different groups. Contact Butch Evans for the results for other NCGA and SIR State events.
