

Pheasant Run in Chowchilla was the venue for our individual match in February. Fifty-six golfers were divided into 5 flights based on handicaps. In the 1st flight, Terry Dondero and Mike Rumley tied for first with net 68s, Dondero coming out on top in the tiebreaker (low net on the back nine). In flight 2 Charlie Juarique was first at net 67 followed by Gilbert Matossian at net 69. The 3rd flight had Mike Torigian on top at net 66 with Frank Kurihara in second at net 68. John Briceno went low in flight 4 with a net 63 followed by Bob Rathburn at net 68. In the 5th flight Stan Littleworth had lowest net of the day at 61 with Gene Marshall placing 2nd at net 72. In the CTP contests, Mike Rumley at 4' 1" edged out Paul Hyland at 4' 6" on hole #4. On the 17th hole Don Corley took first at 7' 11" followed by Gary Parnell at 11' 6".

Good news from our handicap chairman John Brechman. John relayed that we were over the 100 mark for renewed or new handicaps for 2013. SIR Area 29 golf coordinator Butch Evans pointed out that 100+ handicap members for SIR 159 allows us to qualify for more spots in associate NCGA competitive events.
