# **GOLFERS CORNER**

Wow...the warm weather has come on quickly. Just a few matches ago we were getting rained on at Valley Oaks. Now

we're starting to bake in the 90 plus degree weather. To combat the warmer weather our tee times will switch to 8:00 AM in mid May, starting with our match at Madera Muni on the 16th. We'll put out an email to our members before that match to remind you of the change.

Our flighted individual match in April was held at Valley Oaks in Visalia. The individual match, held on the first Thursday of each month, is a nice change of pace...it's the one time we get to play in foursomes against SIRs of comparable golfing ability (with similar handicaps). In the 1st flight at Visalia Oaks Terry Dondero came out on top with net 69 followed by Jim Morgan with net 72. In the 2nd flight it was Don Avakian capturing first with net 67 and George Rodriguez placing 2nd with net 71. In flight 3 John Crawford edged out Russ Hewer for top honors in the tiebreaker, both with net 69. In the 4th flight Rick Pezzi placed first with net 67 and Vic Froehmer was 2nd with net 75. In the CTP contests. Rich Fimbres was closest on the Lake's #4 at 6' 3" followed by Gary Smith at 18' 1". On the Oak's #5 Smith was again in the money at 18' even and James Noriega placed 2nd at 19' 7".

The competitive golf season has kicked off with a few of our SIRs qualifying for the next stages of competition. Butch Evans had an up and down round in a qualifier for the Public Links Net Championship at Riverside on the March 28. He had a couple shots go OB on his front side but had a great putting day with a total of only 26 putts to move on for the finals. He'll be playing in the Championship rounds at Spyglass Hill and Bayonet GC on April 29 & 30. Three SIR 159 twosomes are moving on to the sectionals for the NCGA Associate Club Four-Ball Net Championship. Representing SIR 159 will be Jim Morgan & Ray Phillips, Butch Evans & John Adams and Lee Moy & Mike Moyle. They'll be playing their qualifier at San Juan Oaks (near Hollister) on May 29.

On the SIR State golf scene, the Area 29 qualifier for the Sir State Team (scramble) Championship will be held at Ridge Creek (Dinuba) on the 28th of May. Butch will be sending out some information on the A, B, C & D player handicap guidelines. Start thinking about getting a team together for this fun competition. The finals will be held at Stevinson Ranch on August 12th.

Monthly golf chairman for April was Duke Marshall. Duke wanted to thank his able assistant Russ Hewer for doing a great job collecting money for the matches. Duke had a few comments about his

month as chairman. He reiterated that from now on (see 159 golf email on April 21) any group playing in scrambles that doesn't indicate the drives used for each individual on the scorecard will be DQued (disqualified). Also that if you signed up for but can't make the match...it is really, really helpful to let the chairman know if possible the night before. On the day of the match you can even call the chairman on his cell phone (listed on the pairings page). Finally...our club should consider making 30 minutes before tee time the cut off for who is allowed to play in the tournament. As it is...we seem to have too many players rolling in 10 minutes beforehand (while the chairman is packing up his materials).
