


Please continue to support 159 with participation in our Activities and be sure to bring new member and friends to our luncheons. I'll see you all on June 13.

Joe Marshall walked away with flight 5 at net 63. Rick Pezzi was 2nd at net 65. In the 6th flight Robert Anderson had low net of the day at 61. Stanley Littleworth followed with a net 66. On CTP hole #2 Bob Dickson was close at 5' 9" followed by Joe Russo at 8' 2". On CTP #13 Nick Fierro took first at 8' 9" and Bob Dickson was in the money again at 9' even.

Madera Muni was the kickoff site on May 16th for our annual Ron Rich Memorial Match Play Tournament. Spanning a period of 10 weeks, this is our only match play event of the year. 32 players who signed up for the event were separated into 4 flights based on handicaps. Each flight was then seeded (first match had lowest handicap player in the flight playing against highest handicap player in that flight, etc.). #### "GOOD LUCK, MR. GORSKY"

Who is Mr. Gorsky?

ule, Neil Armstrong was the first person to set foot on the moon. You'll get sex when the kid next door walks on the moon!
