

Dell Kerns was first in the 4th flight with net 69, Jim Knapp placed second with net 72. On CTP hole #7 Nichols was close at 5' 10" with Joe Hushek next at 8' 8". On CTP #17 Dana Kahler was very close at 1' 1" followed by Bob Dickson at 9'.

On OCT 25 close to 50 of our golfers gathered at the Ramada to enjoy our annual golf awards luncheon. Everyone who attended received a raffle door prize that was golf related. Many trophies were awarded to golfers who had earned them in our major tournaments in 2013. In the Golfer of the Year competition (points awarded for rounds of play and placing in the money in recordable round matches) Vic Froehmer was 4th with 93 points. Tied for 2nd, both with 95 points, were Bob Moore and James Noriega. Our Golfer of the Year for 2013 with a total of 108 points was

Rick Pezzi. In the Team Player of the Year competition (point structure the same but for non recordable matches) Don Avakian placed 2nd at 123 points. Team Player of the Year with a total of 139 points was George Rodriguez. Awarded for the first time this year was the Dan Aller Most Improved Trophy. This went to Dennis Costello who lowered his handicap index by 4.8 strokes. The final awards (\$) for the day went to the 5 golfers who played in the most matches from OCT 1, 2012 to OCT 1, 2013. Placing 5th and playing 39 weeks was Jim Whitmere (\$15). Placing 4th and playing 40 weeks was Rick Pezzi (\$30). Tied for 2nd, both with 41 plays, were Don Avakian and Bob Moore (\$52.50 each). Playing the most times last year, with a total of 43 plays, was Mike Williamson (\$75).

Discussed at the luncheon were some things that will be new in 2014. 1) The third match of each month will now have only one format, either a scramble or shamble. There will be no recordable rounds played on that day. 2) JAN, MAY, JUL and OCT all have 5 matches next year. On the 5th week of those months the monthly chairman can opt to conduct a novelty match. 3) We have a handicap committee that is up and running. The committee will be checking on player handicaps and possibly restrict handicaps of golfers that are abusing the system. 4) New award that will be handed out annually at our awards luncheon will be the Most Inspirational trophy. The trophy will be named after our buddy Terry Dondero who recently passed.
