



SIR OF THE MONTH JAMES NORIEGA

In 1946 an American born woman of Mexican ancestry gave birth in Clarksdale, Arizona to a boy, whom she named James Noriega. Her husband was a migrant worker from Mexico who worked in the mines located in Clarksdale. In the 40s the borders with Mexico were open, and people could cross over at will. Thus began the multicultural education of James.

He was a fortunate child in that he got to go to 1st grade twice. Once in the U.S., and again, in Mexicali, Mexico. You see, he became quite ill the summer following his 1st experience in 1st grade, and James was moved to Mexicali where his grandmother could care for him. This was in 1950. In the fall, feeling better, he was sent to school in Mexicali where the school placed him in 1st grade for the second time. There were 52 students in the class, and the teacher taught him discipline. Each morning the students were fed eggs and oatmeal for breakfast at the school. The next summer he again became quite ill again, and was held out of 2nd grade for the year. He says, "I never got to learn my addition facts." As a result, he developed his own method of adding numbers. He uses his personal method of adding to this day.

By the time he was ready to start school again, he had moved to Coachella, California with his family and some of his brothers and sisters. Due to his age and size, the school put him into third grade. Because small chil-



dren learn languages so quickly, James is fluent in both English and Spanish without any accent in either language.

As a child during the summers of his growing up years, James worked with his family in the fields around Fresno. In the off season, they would go back to school in

Coachella. This went on until he graduated from high school in 1965 from Coachella Valley High.

Out of high school, he enrolled for the fall semester at Fresno State College (now University). When asked why Fresno state, he said he liked it here in Fresno. James graduated from FSU in 1969 with a BA in Mathematics.

In the fall of 1969 he began his educational career as a math teacher in Tulare at Tulare Western High. He had not yet earned his teaching credential. James had entered the Intern Teacher Program at Fresno State. He went to education classes at night and during the following summer. After a year of taking education classes, he earned his Lifetime Teaching Credential. This was in 1970.

With credential in hand, James transferred to Fresno Unified. He was assigned to Sequoia Middle School as a math teacher. After 8 years with junior high students (this helps explains some of his behaviors) He became a math teacher at McLane High School.

James earned his counseling credential in

1988. As a result he became a counselor at McLane. He came to enjoy highland dancing and bagpipes. James saw an opportunity to help council kids with needs, so he moved to Edison High School in 1977 as a counselor. The district, in a reorganization, transferred James to Sunnyside High in 2000. He was again reorganized to Bullard High in 2003. By 2006, James decided it was time to retire from Fresno Unified and leave his education career behind him. James had spent 37 years as an educator.

James is happily married to Debbie. They were married in 1975. Their daughter Allison is their only child. She is a chiropractor, married to a chiropractor and resides in Pennsylvania. Debbie works at Community Medical Center as a social worker.

You will often find James on the golf course playing with friends or the Branch 159 golf group. He also likes to bowl. James bowls with the Branch 159 group and on Friday afternoons.

James is presently serving as Little SIR for Branch 159. In January 2014 he will become the Big SIR. We wish him great fortune as he leads Branch 159 in 2014.
