# SIR OF THE MONTH – Dennis Costello

He enjoyed being a "military brat", because his family traveled all over the country and world. He lived in Florida, the Panama Canal Zone, Rhode Island, Anchorage, Alaska, and San Bernardino. While in R. I. he attended a catholic grammar school. He loved the Nuns. He kept in touch with his 6th and 8th grade teacher.

His high school days were spent in Anchorage. Alaska. While in high school, Dennis played football, but not for the high school. He was a member of a base youth football team. This was Elmendorf Air Force Base. They played against the local High school. He also played American Legion baseball. During his high school summers, Dennis was a forest fire fighter.
