

#### SIR TAKES HONOR FLIGHT

Back in 2005, a program was begun to bring WWII veterans to Washington D.C. to visit the newly completed National WWII Memorial, a monument dedi- and Branch of Service of each of you who once served cated to those who served in WWII. The program was in the Military of The United States of America. All designed to bring these veterans to Washington free! Over the years this program has grown having brought well over 100,000 veterans each along with a 'guardian' to accompany them. While the veteran travels at no cost, the guardian is charged some amount, small as it is, to cover his/her cost with some left over to help finance what is now called 'Honor Flight'.

Recently, an Honor Flight Fresno Chapter was begun. Over the short period of its existence, it has take three excursions to the Capital. Only a few weeks ago, three members of SIR #159 took this special trip. Our SIR team included Jack Leonard, John Pokorny and Stan Weinstein. Their excursion began early morning, June 24 with a grand sendoff by a crowd of people gathered at the airport to wish them God-Speed. After landing in Baltimore, MD, they were shuttled off to a hotel for dinner and rest.

The following morning, the group, some 67 of them, were transported to the Memorial. They were joined by Honor Flight groups from other cities across the nation. 
