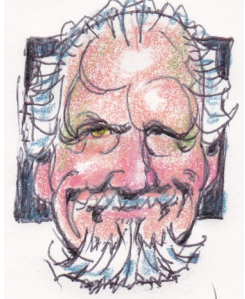
It was table 12 that suffered the most. Famine! February 12, 2015 was the day the food ran out at Pardini's before all the SIR were served.

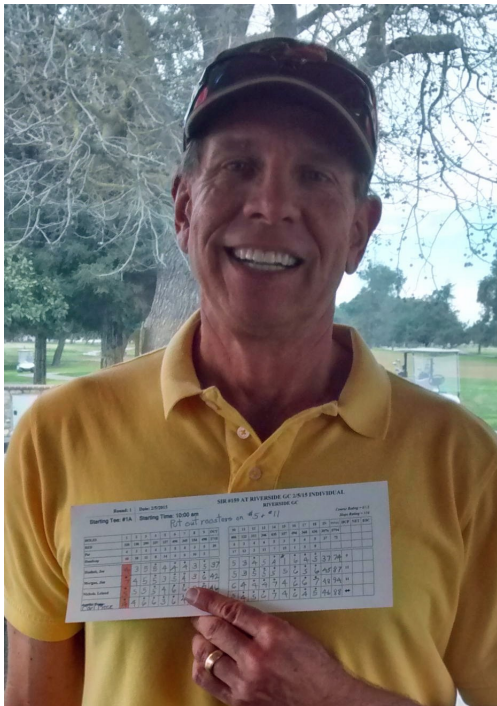

Many thanks go to Dennis Ensminger and assistant Alex Ramirez for orchestrating with precision our four February events. This is the 6th year Dennis has volunteered and Alex will be our new November chairman.

At our first monthly event at **Riverside GC**, it was nice to see the thick morning fog had disappeared. 45 players competed in the individual net stroke format, from the red tees. SIR Joe Hushek, from 150 yards with an 8 iron aced the #15 hole par 3, and easily won

Flight 1. Many thanks to Joe for inviting us to join him celebrate his first Hole-in-One. Reg Rosander won a disputed F2 (6 players within 4 strokes), while Dana Kahler lead F3 with a 3 strokes margin and Rich Pezzi won F4. Unfortunately, some pairings took an excessive time to compete the 18 holes, and a 2 stroke penalty was assessed to a few players.

On the following Wednesday, under spring like temperature, 55 players competed from the Gold tees at **Belmont GCC**, one of SIR's favorite course with plenty of mature trees bordering the flat fairways, and tricky bunkers protecting tough greens. All teams played within the allocated time and no penalty was assessed. The 4Men Scramble was won (low net 46.5) by Montejano/Avakian/Torigian & Williamson, 3 strokes ahead of second place. Ten teams competed in the 4M2BB event, where Paul Gabrielson helped by Mike Rumley (net 68), Gary Smith and Ed Beier harbored a 2 stroke victory over the teams led by Nichols and Matossian. Gabrielson was on fire (low net 65, 1st and 3rd in the CTPs). Duke's low net of 66 was probably the result of the good marine air from the Mexico cruise.

Our 3rd monthly game took place at **Airways GC** under sunny skies. Eleven teams competed in the Shamble. Vonberg/Jones/Daniels/Cooper won the event 3 strokes ahead of Fierro/Ensminger/Pezzi/Ketcham. A shamble is not a reportable score, nevertheless great low net by Jones (59), Damico (60), Daniels and Morales (61). On the CTP contests, we were 2 inches away from recording another ace when on hole #7 Gary Kilgore's ball hit the green, rolled toward the cup, went around the cup but did not drop in, yet a great shot. Russ Hewer won the CTP #15.

Well fellow roosters, our attendance keeps getting higher, as 69 players participated at our **Dragonfly GC** tournaments under sunny skies. The course was in great condition and the greens were greens. It seems the new owners are doing a much better job. Kurihara/Briceno won with 60, 1 stroke less than Price/Barton. Let's congratulate Joe Hushek for a low gross of 72 (no typo here, it's a 72 gross score!!). Good combined performance of Morgan and Bencivengo on the CTPs.

**I stopped believing his tall tales when I grew up, but Grandpa Joe lived on for a lot more years, enjoying perfect health until the ripe old age of 107. He left behind 14 children, 30 grandchildren, 45 great-grandchildren, 25 great-great-grandchildren -- and a 15-foot crater where the crematorium used to be.**
