We collected eggs and cleaned out our hen house. Pop raised rabbits and chickens starting with the Big War. Rationed meat stamps were used for beef and pork.

Just about everything else was rationed. We saw what our chores brought, understood the food chain and thought life was good in our small town.

Back, during the War, we were proud to know the Kettleman Hills oil field, above Avenal supplied a major portion of the oil for America's war effort. We had something to strut about.

Last month's speaker hit a major league bases loaded home run. Avenal born Fresno Grizzly GM, Derek Franks spoke of the ball club's plans and exciting successes. Fresno is getting much better baseball, entertainment, and wins.

Derek, his dad, Mike and I may have set a record of three former Avenal guys in the same Fresno restaurant. I thought I learned enough from Derek to feel like an expert...sort of. Good deal.

SIR JOHN JOSEPH BRECHMANN

John Joseph Brechmann was born at Saint Agnes Hospital (the original Hospital) in Fresno, California on a hot August 23rd in 1935. He was the last of 4 children, all brothers. His 3 older brothers each fought in WWII. One surviving the battle of the bulge with nothing more than a small fingernail size piece of shrapnel that his buddy removed with a bayonet. He refused to go see a medic, because he didn't want a Purple Heart for such a small wound. This is the stuff of which John and his brothers were made.



John's first school was Kindergarten at Heaton Elementary. For 1st grade, he was transferred to Saint Theresa's. He was there for all 6 grades. While in elementary school he participated in Catholic Youth Athletics, (CYO). Following, his elementary years, SIR John was promoted to San Joaquin Memorial. At that time boys went to San Joaquin Memorial from 7th thru 12th grades. In junior high, John was not only an athlete, but he was an academic scholar. This earned him a scholarship for the 9th and 10th grades at Memorial. He was admitted tuition free for those 2 years. This made his pappy happy.

During high school and junior high, John was active in sports. He earned 8 Varsity letters and 2 Jr Varsity letters. Baseball was his prime sport. He played it all 6 years. He played varsity football for 2 years and the same for basketball. SIR John graduated in 1953.

In 53 he enrolled at Fresno State College in the Civil Engineering program. He worked hard at his studies for 3 years, whereupon he left school to volunteer for the Army

John took his basic training at Fort Lewis. While completing basic training, the army saw that they had a trained civil engineer. The army then sent him OJT (On the Job Training) to the Persideo in San Francisco. He was assigned to the 30th Engineer Battalion, 337th Engineering Company. He spent his service time at the Persideo . John arrived there in November of 1956. In June of 1958 the army decided to reduce its forces and gave him an early out with the requirement that he serve two year on active reserve and 2 years on inactive reserve. Upon returning to Fresno, he joined the Navy Reserve where he served his time.

In 1958, John returned to school at Fresno state. He enrolled in summer school, and found a job working part time for Harold Schlintz & Assoc. He continued his college on a part time basis and graduated in 1963 with a BA in Civil Engineering.

In the interim, on September 5, 1959 John and Kathy Matesso got married. Their first child, Michael was born in September 1960. One more boy followed in January of 1965, his name is Patrick. Each of the sons are married and have children. Michael has 3 daughters. Rebekah is working on a Civil Engineering degree at Fresno State University. Corryn, his 2nd child is a sophomore in high school, and Samantha Jo, is a high school freshman. Patrick has 2 daughters. Samantha Rose, the oldest girl, is attending Fresno State University on a soccer scholarship and taking classes in the Education Department. Her younger sister, Taylor, is a freshman at Fresno City College, and is on the Dean's List.

In 1963, with Civil Engineering degree in hand, John went to work full time for Harold Schintz & Assoc. His job required a lot of time surveying in the mountains around Shaver Lake, Cartwright Reservoir, and Dinky Creek. John tells the story of having to set up a transit in the middle of Dinky Creek road, all the time dodging cars. He was surveying a forest service road outside of the old Pine Mountain Lumber Mill near Dinkey Creek. As part of his job, John and another fellow surveyed a forest service road that ran from Porterville over the mountains to the Eastern Sierras at 9 mile canyon. It was never paved, but probably still exists. Harold Schlintz decided to retire in 1971, and he turned over the entire business to John. John rented office space from Harold for a couple of years, then he move his business to Olive where he rented space. Around 78/79, John decided to own his own building. He built it on Olive and moved his business there.

John switched the focus of his business from surveying to structural engineering shortly after taking over the business. He was very successful working with steel structural engineering. Sometime in 1997/98 John decided it was time to retire, so he closed the business down.

SIR then became prominent in John's life, after playing golf for a few years with his brother and other SIR members. His brother Doran was his sponsor, and he was inducted on July 12, 2001. He became friends with Dave Betts. Dave was the handicap chair at that time. As would have it, Dave moved on to the SIR State Golf Committee. John agreed to take over from him as the SIR 159 Handicap Chair. He continues in that role today. When John started as Handicap Chair, he was also doing the weekly tournament scoring. It is because of John, that each of you golfers have a current NCGA handicap. When you see him at the luncheons, take time to thank John for the service he provides.

In August, we'll have many events: four regular weekly golf games, the Branch Annual Individual Championship (8/6 & 8/12), our branch Qualifier for the Associate Club net Amateur NCGA (8/06) and the SIR State Individual Division 5 Qualifier (8/21).

2015 Annual Branch 159 GOLF Banquet Awards is moved to October 20th, 2015, from 10:00AM to Noon, at Yosemite Falls Cafe (Granite Park), 4020 N. Cedar Ave, Fresno. A full breakfast will be served at 10:30AM; bar will be open for those interested (\$5/+).

Branch 159 Annual Individual Championship (Aug 6 & 12) will play a combined 36 holes. First round will be at Ridge Creek GC and the second round at Riverside GC. Scoring will be Gross and Net stroke with full handicap (as

of 8/1). This is a major event for our branch, with many prizes and awards. Lets have a large field so each of the 4 flights will be balanced and competitive.

Branch 159 Qualifier for the NCGA Associate Club Net Amateur will be played at Ridge Creek on 8/06, concurrently with our branch Championship 1st round. This is an NCGA individual net stroke event, with 100% full handicap. Those interested must sign up for our regular event AND with Mike Moyle (by Monday 08/03 by 8:00PM). Up to 6 players can make the cut to the next level.

NCGA PACE of PLAY. Our players going to any NCGA event need to be aware the NCGA is enforcing the pace of play policy and that our Branch 159 Pace of Play bears little resemblance with the NCGA's guidelines. Knowledge of the rule and of its application is key to avoid a 1, 2, 3 stroke penalty or even a disqualification. The guidelines are available on the NCGA website and also usually part the specific tournament rules handed out by the starter.

The allotted time will vary with each course and at each tournament the NCGA scorecard will indicate the player's expected time position after each hole. This scorecard is like a road map and it is the player's responsibility to know their group position relative to the published Pace of Play. A group is deemed out of position if they are over their allotted time AND more than 14 minutes behind the Whenever group in front of them. available, check the atomic clocks positioned at the tee boxes throughout the course and compare the time with the expected time position for each hole. If these atomic clocks are not available, then ask the NCGA marshals following the players for the official time. Warning or Penalty stroke(s) can be assessed at any check-point holes or during the game.

NCGA Senior Four-ball net local qualifier took place at Sunnyside CC July 29th (White tees 6,470y for seniors !!). Our branch had 2 teams, in a pool of 18 teams, competing for 3 spots. Morgan/Phillips came really close (-4) to making the cut. Matossian/Moyle (-6) took the 3rd spot and are going to the Championship at Poppy Hills GC (Aug 31st & Sept 1st).

DIVISION 5 QUALIFIER for SIR STATE INDIVIDUAL CHAMPION-SHIP. Good luck to branch 159 players competing on August 21st, at Rancho del Rey GC, Atwater, in the local Division 5 qualifier. Mike Moyle & Butch Evans are our Area 29 coordinators (\$45 prepayment due to Butch).

SIR STATE FALL CLASSIC (Sept 14 & 15), Whitney Oaks GC, Rocklin, CA, is organized by our State Golf Committee. Two days of golf (4M2BB & Scramble), ladies welcome. The fee to play both rounds is \$130 (cart + range balls+ large prize fund). For further information, please check the SIR State Golf website, or call Dave Betts (559) 434-1468.

Ron Rich Championship. The final match took place at Dragonfly GC between Dell Kerns and Butch Evans. It was a close match, however Butch pulled out in the last 3 holes to win 3/2. Congratulations to both players for their competitiveness and fair play throughout the tournament.

Riverside GC News. The bunkers with white stakes centered in them on holes 1, 4, 17 and 18 are totally under repair and must be played as Ground under Repair (free relief, 1 club length, not closer to hole). Some bunkers will be removed, and some will be completely redesigned (thick sand, higher banks, larger sand area). Expect these holes to play differently when all work is completed.
