SIR of the Month — Gary Smith

It is September of 1972, and we find Captain Gary Smith in the navigation compartment in the belly of a B-52 over North Vietnam. His instruments tell him that a SAM (Surface to Air Missile) has just been launched. He immediately checks his seat belts to make sure that they are secure, knowing that in 55 seconds he may be on a ride for his life. He doesn't want the seat to leave the plane without him. His ejection position would be down. He then checks to make sure that he had switched the right switches to keep the aborted mission from scattering 88 bombs

over Vietnam. The SAM missed his plane attesting to the fact that he will be our new Little SIR for 2016.



SIR Gary started his life in September 1945 in Cleveland, Ohio. His family consists of Mom and Dad along with 2 sisters and a brother. His first 18 years were spent in Cleveland with an ordinary childhood doing all the things an active child does growing up. He played the 4 major sports in high school. In junior high, he loved horses and a got position at Parker Ranch helping tend the ranch. As it turns out, unknown to him, the owner, Adele Von Ohl, was a contemporary of Any Oakley and Buffalo Bill. She was a trick rider with the Wild

West show. He only learned of this after her death from her obituary. He left Cleveland to attend Bowling Green College

where he earned a degree in Psychology.

Following college, he joined the Airforce. Gary was a navigator from 1970 to 1972. He flew 125 combat missions Over Viet Nam. Upon his discharge in October of 1972, he returned to Ohio.

He wanted to become a lawyer, but the semester had already begun in the law school. He found that he could get into San Juaquin law school in Fresno right away, so he moved here. His wife at the time was from Sacramento, so Fresno was close enough. After arriving in Fresno, they adopted 2 children; a boy, Kyle and a girl, Devon. Both of his children still live in Fresno.

While going to law school, Gary worked as an insurance adjuster. In 1977 he became a lawyer. He practiced civil law until 1998. His specialty was subrogation law. (look it up, I had never heard of it either) He had gotten divorce in 1984. In 1986 he married Charolette, but they got divorced in 1998.

1998 found him in Antioch. He was going back into insurance, but the company he started with went bankrupt 2 months later. (Honestly, Gary had nothing to do with the company folding.) A friend then suggested that he try teaching. After a 30 minute interview, He was hired at Hillview Middle School in Pittsburg, CA. He taught Language Arts and History. During the summer he took classes to get an emergency credential.

While in Antioch, in 1994, Gary and 3 other Civil War reenactment participants go fed up with the group that was running and ruining the west coast reenactment activities. They formed their own group and formed the 20th Maine CoG. This is the group that is featured in the movie Gettysburg. There were tons of interest in their new Association. They called it the American Civil War Association. By the end of their second season, they had 500 members. They grew because of fundamental changes from the previous group and had a clear mission focus. One focus was to have fun. Everyone was welcome especially the families. He was president for 3 years and was "term of office" out. He is proud of the fact that they were the second largest club west of the Mississippi after two years, and were the fastest growing club in the country. After 20 years, the ACWA remains a thriving organization and hosts the Kearney Park reenactment. He would be happy to tell you all about the intrigue that went on with the formation of the ACWA.

Two years of teaching was enough for Gary, in June of 2000 he moved back to Fresno where he met Jeanette. She worked for Las Palmas Counseling, and Jeanette introduced him to her boss. Gary was hired to counsel prisoners who were paroled or being given probation. This allowed him to use the three disciplines, law, psychology, and teaching in which he had gained

experience. Criminals are required to participate in counseling as part of their release. Gary retired from counseling in 2010.

He became a gentleman farmer planting fruit trees. He loves planting hybrids fruits. Some that he has planted are: Plumcot, Pluot, Aprium, nectaplum, peacoeum, pluerry, and pleach. His favorites are pleach and aprium. He and Jeanette have sold their house and are moving to a house off Milburn and Herndon. Gary is trying to figure out how to get 45 trees in a small back yard. He is thinking of starting a SIR gardening group.

Gary joined SIR in 2011. Having met Butch Evans playing golf, Butch became his sponsor. As a SIR, he participates in golf, date nights, and some travel activities. He is happy to see more women getting involved in SIR. Starting in January, SIR Gary will be at the podium introducing our monthly speaker. If you have someone you think would be a good speaker, please contact Gary. He is very approachable.
