
## SIR OF THE MONTH GEORGE N. GIANOPULOS

One day in March, March 2, 1928, to be exact, George N. Gianopulos was born to Greek immigrant parents in Taft, California. He grew up there while attending school thru Junior College. He had worked at many part-time jobs during his growing up years. In fact there were so many interesting jobs, that he wrote a book about them, and published it in 2002.

Following Jr. College, George enrolled at Fresno State College in 1949. He completed a graduate year working on a Teaching Credential. This enabled him to become a high school teacher teaching math and physics. Later in his career, he also,

did graduate work at UCLA, USC, and Pepperdine Universities.

In October of 1950, Uncle Sam said, "George, we need you". He went to basic training at Fort Ord in Monterey, CA. Following basic training, he was sent to White Sands Proving Grounds, New Mexico to work on Rocketry and Guided Missiles. They liked so much what he did there, that they sent him on to spend a year with General Electric, in Schenectady, NY. There he worked on Hermes Missiles. (Surface to Surface Missiles) Following a year at GE, he was sent to Jet Propulsion Libratory (JPL) in Pasadena, CA. Here George worked on the Corporal Missile,



another surface to surface missile. (Guess he just couldn't keep his missiles off the ground.)

George was discharged from the army in 1952. This allowed him to seek his teaching career. He taught math for a year in Tulare, and followed that by teaching both high school and Jr College math and physics in Bakersfield.

The lure of rocketry, guided missiles and space took him to JPL in 1955. He started as a computer programmer, and was soon promoted to a position in charge of 200+ programmers. They worked on design of space craft, trajec-

tory analysis, space control, and telemetry data processing. Following programming, George was put in charge of organization designed 'Mission Control'. The building contained computers, communications-analyst/ computer devices, gee wiz displays, etc. Over the next years, all unmanned space programs were controlled out of that building. His organization supported the Ranger Project (1<sup>st</sup> close-up pictures of the moon), 'Mariner Project' (1<sup>st</sup> Earth to Mars satellite, getting close up pictures of the surface of Mars.), the 'Surveyor Project' (1<sup>st</sup> spacecraft to land on the surface of the moon – there were nine of them, all precursors to the Apollo Project), and finally the 'Viking Project', (Two Orbiters and two landers  $-1^{st}$ Space Ship to land on Mars).

His final position, before retiring from JPL, was Project Manager on Military Projects. This was using space program technology for gathering intelligence data processing in military applications George retired from JPL in 1992.

Upon retiring, George moved to Fresno with his family. He had met his wife, Dorothea, while at Fresno State College. They were married in 1957. This was a few years after he had gone to work for JPL. She was, and still is a pianist, and a piano teacher. They now have two sons.

Outside of his working life, George has been very involved in churches. He led a program through all stages of design, fund raising, construction and furnishing of a new church in Pasadena. In Fresno, he led another team to complete some elements of a church constructed in the 1950s. Through a 10 year effort, they completed the ceiling art work - Iconography. This was completed in 2012. They even had to go to Russia to bring an artist to paint these holy scenes on the ceiling. It is known as "Fresno Sistine Chapel Ceiling". The whole project cost well over \$500,00.

George has been involved in many art related organizations. In Pasadena, he was a member and President for 1 year of the prestigious "Fine Arts Club of Pasadena". Glendale appointed him to the City Planning Board." And, in Fresno, he joined the board for "Phillip Lorenze Memorial Keyboard Concerts". He is Secretary of the Board.

His hobbies are ones you will find him using for SIR 159. He enjoys art and art collecting, photography, and computer technology.

George was wandering aimlessly around Fresno in 1994 when SIR Art Stanton introduced him to SIR 159. He was hooked, and joined. Since joining, George has been very involved. He started out as assistant photographer and later the branch photographer. He became Historian, and in 2008 Little SIR. He was Big Sir in 2009. Following his tenure as Big Sir he didn't quit. George has gone on to be one of the Biographers, Sunshine Chair, and he does computer graphics for SIR 159. From his involvement, you can see why he was awarded Duke Marshall, Attendance Chairman

with the Honorary Life Membership (HLM) in 2013. You will regularly see George doing whatever needs doing to enhance the experiences of the members of SIR Branch 159.

to take a photo of Mike's retrieving his ball... But wait a second, this does not look like a regulation golf hole, it's Footgolf! By the way, Mike got a nice true "par" on this hole.

Thumbs up to Gary Morgan who is learning (very fast) the TPP program to assist our Handicap Chairman in the weekly preparation of the score cards and pairings for our regular golf tournaments. This is a great example of a new member willing to help the branch and fellow golfers. Welcome to the 159 golf team.

**Rule reminder**, as of January 1st 2016, if your ball may be lost outside a water hazard or may be out of bounds, to save time you should play another ball provisionally in accordance with Rule 27-1. You must inform your opponent in match play or your fellow-competitor in stroke play that you intend to play a provisional ball, and you must play it before going forward to search for the original ball. NOTE: if the original ball is neither lost nor out of bounds, the player must abandon the provisional ball and con-

not find your original ball after a 5 minutes search, then you must return to the point where you last hit and incur a 1 stroke penalty (stroke and distance) and count the stroke for the lost ball outside a water hazard or O/B. (Associate Club Competitions do not allow the 6" bump.)

#### 2016 Associate Club Competitions for SIR 159

Has the warm weather got your competitive golf juices flow-The 2016 NCGA competiing? tions for our SIR 159 Associate Club are about to kick off in a few more weeks. If you enjoy playing courses that are new to you and you have a competitive bent...you might give the Associate competitions a try. Listed below are the events that some of our SIR golfers have been playing the last few years. To enter the competitions you must have a current NCGA handicap through SIR (as we represent the SIR 159 Associate Club).

There is no fee for the Branch

159 qualifier for each event other than the normal green fees for the course and our \$5 match fee. The fees that you see listed for the sectional qualifiers and the finals are the green fees that you prepay to the NCGA a few weeks in advance before you play on those days.

For events 1, 2 and 3...play will be at 90% (men) of the course handicap using a maximum handicap index of 18.4 for calculation. All players with indexes of 18.5 and above are eligible to participate but must play to a maximum handicap index of 18.4.

In events 1 & 3 (2manBB), if the partners' course handicaps differ by more than 8 strokes, an additional 10% reduction will be applied to their course handicaps.

EVENT 4 IS THE ONE COMPETI-TION where players can have up to a 36.4 handicap index and play at 100% of their course handicaps.

If you'd like to play in one or more of our Associate Club competitions but don't know who to ask to join you as a team, let me know and I'll give you names of SIR 159 golfers who have played before and help you try to find a partner.
