

### New Member





### A BIOGRAPHY OF LITTLE SIR FOR 2017 — MIKE RUMLEY

Whenever one comes into contact with Mike Rumley, they get a warm friendly feeling. He always has a big teddy bear grin, and he laughs easily. Mike has been elected by the members of SIR Branch 159 to be their Little SIR for 2017.

Mike was born in Fresno on January 17, 1947. He has a younger brother named Jim. Jim lives in Fresno.

recruited to play basketball at Fresno State College. After tial. playing one year Mike decided that it was time to move on to other things.

During his sophomore year in college, Mike went to dances at the old Kearney Bowl. At a Halloween dance in 1966, he met Phyllis, the love of his life. They were married in December of 1967. Phyllis and Mike are coming upon their 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary.

While attending college Mike work as an early morning home delivery milk man. He went to classes in the afternoons, and refereed basketball in the evenings. Talk about multitasking. He would study whenever he could. He had a high motivation to get a degree.

During 1969, his senior year in college, he managed to stay out of the draft, using his student deferment. Both he and Phyllis earned their degrees in 1969. His was in Social Science with a minor in P.E. Phyllis' degree was also, in Social Science.

Mike had a strong desire to become a teacher. Due to the shortage of teachers, Mike was able to score a position as an Intern Teacher. This meant that he would be hired and paid while he completed his 5<sup>th</sup> year earning a credential. He was hired at Kings County Delta View Elementary School. He would then go to education classes the summer before he started teaching; during the year at night while teaching; and the summer after teaching his first year. Again, another example of his multitasking and dedication to achieve. He taught 6, 7, and 8<sup>th</sup> grades all in the same classroom. It was a country school. He also coached afterschool sports. Quite a challenge for a first year teacher, while earning his secondary credential.

In the fall of 1971, Mike was offered a teaching and coaching position in the Clovis Unified School District. He started his Clovis experience at Clark Intermediate School. This was the time when Dr. Buchanan put his great plan into operation to make Clovis schools number 1. Mike was part of that plan. In the fall of 73 he moved to Clovis West High School. He taught everything in the History Department, and coached basketball. Eventually in 1978, he became department chair for the History Department.

While he was at Clark, he had gone back to school and earned a Master's Degree in Secondary Education Administration, and at the same time an elementary creden-

1974 found him becoming a father. Christopher was born in 1974, and in 1978 along came Nathan. Chris went on to become one of the most successful swimmers in Valley History. He was given a full scholarship to University of Michigan, where he was 1st Team All American each of his 4 years. Chris has been inducted into Michigan's Sports Hall of fame for swimming. He still holds two valley swimming records. Chris lives in the Charlotte area of South Carolina and has two children, Page and Hayden. Nathan's sport was football. He was a city/ county All Star. Nathan lives in Fresno, and works as an electrician. He has one son, Logan.

Mike became a consultant for teaching Advance Placement courses in 1990. He traveled the country teaching teachers. This coming year, in June, he will be in Tampa, Florida grading AP Tests as part of his consulting.

In 2006, Mike took an early retirement and left Clovis Unified. He, then, started working for California Virtual Academies. He teaches American History through the internet. He is still doing this activity.

Mike plays golf with SIRs on Mondays and Thursdays as time permits. He enjoys reading historical novels and non-fiction history books. Mike is a part of the SIR History Discussion Group. He finds cooking a fun hobby. Mike won the State of California BBQ Championship in 1984. He often competes in local BBQ competitions as well. He has recently found an interest in the preservation of food. Mike has entered his canning in the Fresno County Fair. You can see his entries at this year's fair in the Home Arts building. He also will enter the salsa competition. Last fall, Mike put on a BBQ for the Monday golf group, and since, along with Steve Chase, he has done so again.

In 2013, Mike joined SIR Branch 159. He had found guys having a lot of fun playing golf at Riverside. He was impressed with their enjoyment. He called a phone number on a card given to him. It was a state SIR office. Mike was told about the 4 branches in Fresno. He chose Branch 159; went to a luncheon, and it turns out it was Ladies Day. He left and came back the next month. This is when he hooked up with an old friend Bill Leavitt. Bill then sponsored Mike for membership. Soon, he became assistant Treasurer and is now ready to become Little SIR for 2017.
