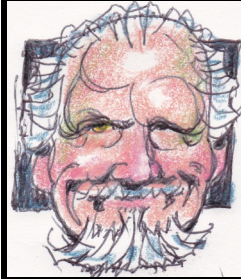

Our History Round Table guys gather to share their bright and cool (Big SIR continued on Page 2)



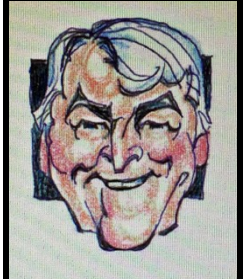
Big SIR Perry

(Little SIR continued from page 1) **responsibility of a SIR is simple- have fun and enjoy our fellowship!** Anything that enables you to enjoy SIR is good; anything that makes your membership less enjoyable is bad. It is that simple. Therefore, do those things that are fun and help us change those things which are not.

2) **The purpose of the Branch Executive Committee is ensure that the 'Fun Factor' is always at the top priority.** Those guys work hard, and sometimes sacrifice some of their own fun to benefit the membership. So if you have a suggestion on how to improve things, your input is always appreciated. I will be available to take your suggestions from 9:06-9:13 on alternate Saturdays. Mike Rumley will be available all times day or night.

3) **Every member is as valuable as every other member.** A one month member is no less valuable as a life

member. All members are equally respected. A member who cannot, or desires not to participate in club functions is no less valuable as the member who puts in 30 hours a week on club stuff.

Having said that, I again urge that you get involved in our functions and volunteer to help in some area, not as an obligation, but because you are needed and your participation enhances your experience.

4) **We must aggressively recruit new blood.** I believe that we are at, or slightly below the optimum number. But the nature of SIR requires a constant influx of new members just to keep the number constant. **Steve Chase** once asked me why we need to grow. I frankly had a hard time answering, but, I think I now know why. Our membership is in a constant state of flux so we need new members just to stay even. But more than that, the bigger we are the more people we have to fill the needed positions. Typically, only about 10-15% of any group take an active role. That means that in our group of 200 or so members, only 20-30 will be volunteers. Branches that are small have an almost impossible problem filling their positions. Also, the larger the group the more functions are available.

Therefore, I ask each of you, over the next year, to invite at least one friend or acquaintance to a luncheon. Our branch is excellent in turning guests into members. For each guest we get 1/2 a member. One month we only had one guest. It was murder the next month dragging that 1/2 member into his seat. Fortunately it was the upper half so he could see and hear the program. The problem was, we forgot to drag him back out and he was in that chair for a whole month until the next luncheon.

Finally, I want to thank you for your friendship and support over the last year and I wish you all a very merry Christmas.

Biography of SIR Joe (Duke) Marshall

Kansas City, Missouri welcomed a new boy into a predominantly Irish neighbor on January 14, 1947. He was named Joseph Marshall, soon to be known as Duke. Duke went to local elementary, junior, and high schools. There were always lots of kids around to play with (about 20 in a four block square). In school, he ran track, played base-



ball, and freshman year played football. He only weighed 95 lbs at the time.

Twice a day, from when he was 11 years old to 15 years of age, he delivered newspapers. He and another boy would start at 3 am, riding in the back of a truck driven by the route manager, delivering 600 papers on each run. Many of the deliveries would be made to 6 story high apart-

ment houses. There were no elevators. Single unit house were thrown from the back of the open truck. This went on daily, rain or snow. When they finished the route in winter, often he and the other boy would hang on the back rails of the truck and ski on the bottom of their shoes with no skis. They called this “gouling”. (Can you imagine this being allowed by kids today?)

Shortly after high school, Duke enlisted in the Navy. He traveled by train to San Diego for boot camp. Following basic training, he was sent OJT (on the job training) to Alameda, California. He worked and learned about atmospheric sciences and weather. This was pre computers, so everything was plotted by hand.

When the Pueblo was captured by the North Koreans, the Navy activated reserve squadrons. Duke was transferred to a reserve squadron to fill their ranks. His new assignment was as a plane captain. This meant that he was responsible to insure that the plane was properly loaded and ready to fly. The unit trained at Lemoore, CA. The squadron was subsequently assigned to the USS Ranger. They completed more training off the coast of California. Two days before deployment to Viet Nam, the unit was

The regulars were reassigned according to Navy policy. He ended up back at Alameda. While there, Duke made “rate”, AG3, as an Aerographer (Weather Man). He spent the last year and a half of his tour operating computers, processed weather data. He was Honorably Discharged on September 1, 1970.

In the meantime, while stationed at Lemoore, he came carousing, with his buddies, to Fresno. He had heard about a dance club called “The Place”. Ron Pearson and the Ron Dons were appearing there. He and his buddies spotted a group of girls, so they approached them and integrated. The group mixed it up dancing. Duke became attracted to one of the girls. Her name was Janis. They hit it off and started dating. His first date was to see the movie “Women in Love”. It was a class assignment for Janis.

This led to their marriage in August of 1969. She began teaching in 1970, while Duke started at Fresno State College. In 1976, their first daughter, Helen, was born. Their second daughter, Maureen, was born in 1979. Helen has gone on to be a pharmacist, with a specialty in

oncology. Maureen is now an archeologist at the University of Illinois. Sadly, as of this date no grand children

At Fresno State, Duke majored in Math with minors in Physics and Chemistry. He earned his BS in 1973. Duke went on to complete his fifth year to earn a secondary teaching credential in 1974.

He started his teaching career at Yosemite Middle School teaching Math. In 1985, he moved to Roosevelt High School teaching all levels of math. 1999 found him participating in opening the new Sunnyside High School. He was assigned as the math department chair. He continued teaching all levels of math along with his chair duties. At the end of the 2008 school year, Duke retired.

In September of 2008, Duke fulfilled his greatest dream. He traveled to the “Motherland” (Ireland). The thing, that made it so special, was that in 1985 he had begun reading on Irish history. He was able to go to the historical places that he had read about. His grandma’s house was an emotional moment; even though he couldn’t get next to it. It was being protected by a very large mean bull. You will often find Duke with earphones hanging out of his ears. Usually he is listening to Irish music.

In 2009, James Noriega asked Duke if he wanted to play golf with a group of guys. This was how he was introduced to SIR. He was “sworn in” at the January luncheon of 2010. By 2012, he was sharing scoring duties with Rich Colby and John Crawford. He now does it all. Duke became attendance chair in November of 2012. Now he has, also, accepted a position on the SIR 159 Board of Directors for 2017-2019. This is in addition to all of his other duties. Duke is very involved in our SIR branch. He maintains the bowling page on the 159 web site, and submits reports for the Chanticleer. We, SIR 159 members, are very fortunate to have willing participants like Duke in our branch. These are the people who make SIR Branch 159 the Greatest SIR Branch in the World.

Tribute to Former Big SIR — Charlie Barrett

Fresno has Van Ness Avenue , Clovis has Clovis Avenue, and SIR Group 159 has Barrett's Path. An event took place at Riverside Golf



Course while Charlie was playing with the Whitemer's Warriors as he was filling his term as Big SIR for SIR Group 159. I will let Charlie tell you about the event in his own words:

Over the next few weeks, I will have much time to consider content as I convalesce from a broken ankle that I foolishly suffered on Monday At Riverside Golf Course. At hole no. 12. ALONE! In the RAIN! While my pals prudently remained in the clubhouse during the rain squall, I decided to press on and play the back nine alone. I played ten and eleven pretty well for me. At twelve, I got off a better than average drive, and pitched on. After reaching in regulation, (I had knocked it close! All that remained was a six foot putt for birdie. A BIRDIE ON TWELVE AT RIVERSIDE!) The cart path on 12 is 15 feet higher than the level of the green. I parked the cart and grabbed my putter, then headed down the grassy slope toward the green when the water on the grass turned my right foot into a ski. As my right foot

raced ahead, my trailing left foot went over the toe to the uphill side while my huge rear end came down on it hard, twisting it into a nasty spiral break. The pain was incredible! I rolled onto the green, and found myself in a soggy prone position, with my right eye looking at my ball and the pin at worm's eye level. The pain from my putt! Sloppy wet, but straight! "I can make this putt!" I WAS ALONE! "How do I get this pin out of the hole? I can't have a two stroke penalty spoil my birdie! I say, How can my foot hurt this much and be numb at the same time?" I crawled over behind the ball. "I can stand up!, pull out the pin, and sink this puttif I can just stand up I can't stand up..... It won't count if I roll it in with my hand. This close, but I CAN'T STAND UP!" I crawled to the golf cart where I drove back to the clubhouse where my buddies gave me sympathy, and helped get me into my car-which I was able to drive with my good foot. So, here I am with six weeks to stare at the fiberglass splint on my left ankle, and visualize that putt rolling in for birdie on hole number twelve at Fresno's Riverside - in the rain!>
