The cruise set sail late afternoon on Monday the 6th. Tuesday was scheduled for a day in Catalina...but due to windy conditions and possible safety concerns boarding the tenders required to get from the ship to land...anchoring by Catalina was postponed until Wednesday. That turned out to be a good thing, as Catalina had received quite a bit of rain on Monday and the golf course was actually closed down on Tuesday due to soggy conditions. Golfers Corner

In addition to the weekly events that Branch 159 hosts all year long, there are 5 golf Special Events available to the SIR branch 159 players with a more competitive mind. Here is a summary of current information for these tournaments.

- **1. SIR Branch 159:** Branch Championships (Individual & Team), Ron Rich (Match play), and Holiday Cup (Gross and Net play, 2x18 holes, during the Xmas season), all events hosted by Branch 159.
- **2. SIR Area 29 Championship,** is a team (6 man) event to determine the #1 branch in the Fresno area. Net play (18 holes). Each branch can sign up more than one team.
- **3. SIR State Championships** events are ruled by the SIR State Golf Committee, the player must hold a SIR GHIN handicap:
- . Individual Championship (Net stroke, 7 flights): Area Qualifier, then Division Qualifier and the Championship (7 flights, 18 holes) to decide who is the best SIR golfer.
- . Team Championship (Scramble 4 men ABCD): one Area Qualifier, then the Championship (18 holes) to decide who is the best SIR Scramble team.
- **4. SIR State Tournaments**: 1 or 2 days of fun golf, events are open to all SIR members, some to guests as well: Napa, Reno, Fall Classic (in Fresno). These events are hosted and ruled by the SIR State Golf Committee. Information is posted on the SIR State Golf and on our golf website.
- **5.** NCGA Associate events: must hold a SIR GHIN handicap, all play follows USGA rules (i.e. no 6" lie bump). There is a branch qualifier (hosted by us), then a local qualifier and a championship (both hosted by
