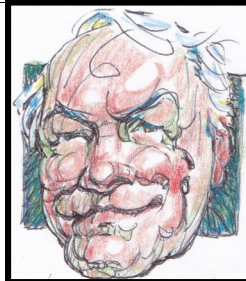

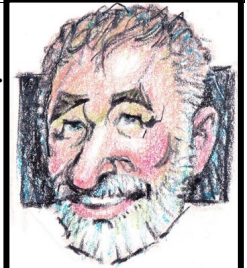

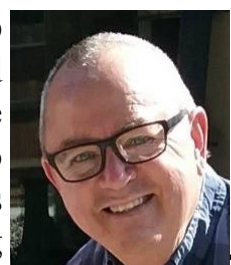

New Members

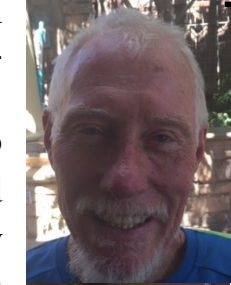

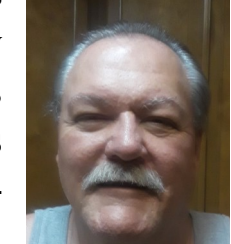
