#### VETERANS TODAY

The military men and women who serve and protect the U.S. come from all walks of life; they are parents, children, grandparents, friends, neighbors and coworkers, and are an important part of their communities. Here are some facts about the veteran population of the United States:

- 16.1 million living veterans served during at least one war.
- 5.2 million veterans served in peacetime.
- 2 million veterans are women.
- 7 million veterans served during the Vietnam War.
- 5.5 million veterans served during the Persian Gulf War.

Of the 16 million Americans who served during World War II, about 558,000 are still alive.

2 million veterans served during the Korean War.

6 million veterans served in peacetime.

As of 2014, 2.9 million veterans received compensation for service-connected disabilities.

As of 2014, 3 states have more than 1 million veterans among their population: California (1.8 million), Florida (1.6 million) and Texas (1.7 million).

The VA health care system had 54 hospitals in 1930, since then it has expanded to include 171 medical centers; more than 350 outpatient, community, and outreach clinics; 126 nursing home care units; and 35 (Little SIR continued on page 3) (Gary Smith continued from page 2) cerned about these changes for several reasons.

The State Board (SB) has limited power to make fundamental changes to the nature and mission of SIR without a vote of the membership in toto, and I believe that many of the proposed changes go beyond the power of the board.

The SB " ... shall have and exercise the powers set forth in this Article" (State Manual Article 7, Division 2 Rule 200)

"They may adopt such Standing Rules, not inconsistent with the Articles of Incorporation." (Section 201).

So the SB is limited to making or amending changes in the existing Rules. It is not empowered to do anything else insofar as changing the mission and statement of purpose of SIRS. Those are not addressed in the Rules. It cannot change the name of the organization as that is a matter of the Articles of Incorporation. Any attempt to alter the organization by adding new rules not contemplated in the manual and claiming that the SB can add new Rules at their pleasure would negate the purpose of limiting SB power in the existing Rules.

I am not implying that there is any nefarious purpose to any change or that the changes would not benefit the organization. My complaint is to the process. I believe that any change, of any kind, which changes the nature of SIR to any degree, should, and must, be thoroughly vetted by the membership as a body before it is implemented. The SB should be merely ministerial. It should not oversee the nature of SIR, merely the business.

This is not to say that the SB has no right to propose changes notwithstanding their limitations under the Rules. In other words, propose away, but pass nothing without the overt consent of the body of members. My complaint is that to implement changes, any changes, outside their func-

tionary/ ministerial capacity is overreach and must be curtailed. The SB exists solely for the benefit of the branches and the membership, not vice versa. Anything effecting members should, and must, never be put in place without the authority and consent of them as a body.

Any attempt to do so without such consent must be vigorously rejected.

P.S. I have just learned of the proposed change to the logo. How ridiculous! Any change must satisfy two tests. First is there a need for the change? Second, does the change address and remedy the problem. In the case of the logo neither test is met. The trademarked logo has been a positive symbol of SIR for the entire time I have been a member. Is is colorful, distinctive and carries no negative connotation. Quite the contrary.

Making a change for the sake of making changes seems to me to be an act of vanity and nothing else. Under no circumstance should the logo be changed.
