Message from the BIG SIR: [continued]

Congratulations to you, our members. In 2018 you increased our membership by a net of 6 members, and you are off to a great start for 2019. You are doing a fantastic job in recruiting and increasing our membership. Let's keep it up—and a big thank you for your support and efforts. Our goal should be to increase by a net of 10 new members or plus 5% this year. Let your officers know how we can help in the efforts to get new members and retain the current members we have.

Final 2018 SIR branch numbers are in and all the following information can be found on the State website.

Total branches in the SIR organization is 117. From a numbers standpoint, 39 of the branches increased membership in 2018. From a percentage of branches increasing membership, that equates to 33% of branches increasing membership.

Comparing the top ten branches:

Reviewing the top ten branches, only 9 branches had more members than our branch.

Comparing the top nine branches to our branch, ONLY one branch increased at a numbers and percentage rate higher than our branch—our branch increased by 6 members or 2.94% and branch 128 increased by 14 members or 4.9%.

Reviewing the top ten branches with the most members—6 branches decreased membership and of the remaining 4 branches we had the second highest increase from both a numbers and percentage standpoint. Numbers from the top ten branches ranged from a minus 2 members to plus 14 members.

I attended a State Little & Big Sir meeting on the 12th of February and I believe that our State Leaders have the best of intentions to help increase membership and make SIR an organization with interests that will attract gentlemen with leisure time to improve our lives through fun activities, luncheons and events, while making Friends for Life. We may not agree with all their methods, but we should not question their intentions.

Major areas covered at the meeting:

- 1—Budget. While they presented 2018 financials showing a net income, they also presented a 2019 budget projecting a slight loss. However, even with a decline to income and an increase to costs, they feel that 2019 will not see a increase to branches in the state assessment—overall they feel the projection for 2019 is a "conservative" budget number.
- 2—Insurance. We were assured, at the meeting, that our policy was put out to bid and we received the best deal possible. Insurance is about 50% of the State budget.
- 3—Bylaws. For those who log onto the state website, you can find a great deal of information on our SIR organization. Members of the rules committee are in the process of finalizing a welcome change to the bylaws. The new version of the bylaws will be available in the next few months. A lot of work has gone into this project and those involved should be congratulated for a job well done.
- 4—The current logo and emblem. While State intends to implement the new logo and emblem, they have agreed that branches are free to choose the logo and emblem we currently have OR use the new one.

Don't forget your 2019 assessment is now due. The window for payment runs through the March luncheon, after which your account is considered delinquent.
