- 2—Approved Bylaw changes. The Policy and Procedure committee has done an excellent job of streamlining the bylaws making them much easier to understand and follow.
- 3—Review of the budget showing actual, to date, being in line with projections, however, with declining overall 2019 membership (-3.14%) and increased costs, they are projecting a \$1.00 per member state assessment increase for 2020. Currently \$6.00 per member goes from each branch to state.
- 4—A presentation by Dr. Ritchie-UCSF discussing "Improving Longevity" through interaction with others by belonging to organizations such as SIR.
- 5—Three themes were presented and discussed to get members involved to improve longevity and enjoy membership in SIR—Physical engagement; Mental engagement and Social engagement.
- 6—Updates presented for State sponsored golf, bowling, bocce and help from the State to improve the programs.
 7—The Best Branch Awards. Your branch was presented a "Best Branch Award" for 2018. Only 11 branches of the 114 branches in SIR received this special recognition. Mike Rumley—thank you for your excellent leadership.

Enjoy the holiday with family and friends and remember, schools are back in session, so be extra careful as you drive around our cities. Kids being kids means it is up to us to be vigilant and help them be safe.


Please mark your calendars for September 13th. That's the date of our next luncheon, Friday the 13th, lucky Friday the 13th.




