SIR Minutes of Branch 159 Executive Committee

September 9, 2021

The meeting opened at 10:15 am at Pardini's Restaurant. BEC officers present were Big Sir Bruce Corwin, Little Sir Stuart Poytress, Assistant Treasurer Brett Bayley, and Secretary Robert Scott. Directors present were Steve Chase (2021), John Crawford (2022), Javier Rodrigues (2023), and Richard Glover (2023). Excused from the meeting were Assistant Secretary Vic Froehmer, Treasurer Brian Nickerson, Director Pete Openshaw (2021), and Director Thomas Simpson (2022). Bruce Corwin proclaimed a quorum was present (8 of 12).

Next, a review of the August 12, 2021 meeting minutes was conducted. Steve Chase moved that the minutes be approved as presented, and Stuart Poytress seconded the motion. The minutes were approved unanimously.

It was reported that "callers" had submitted their reports, and we expect 90 Branch 159 members to attend today's luncheon. At our August luncheon, we actually had more members attend than we expected.

Stuart Poytress announced that Edward Antenucci, one of our new members, would be presenting information at our luncheon about the real estate market in Fresno. Ed is a real estate investor in Fresno. Then, a short discussion developed regarding speaker programs and the time allotment for each speaker. Next, Stuart Poytress announced that he had a tentative agreement with Alan Autry, former actor and mayor of Fresno, to speak at our luncheon on October 14th.

It is important to note that George Gianopulos is one of our Honorary Life Members.

John then presented a potential candidate, Charles Brough, who would be confirmed by approval of this report. Steve Chase moved that the Membership Report be approved, and Brett Bayley seconded the motion. The report was unanimously approved. John also reviewed the Monthly Branch Membership Report (Form 27). Referring to Form 27, John reminded us that we have gained 16 members this year but lost 19. Stuart Poytress moved that Form 27 be approved, and Rich Glover seconded the motion. The report was unanimously approved.



Golf Awards Lunch


