

#### SIR Minutes of Branch 159 Executive Committee

#### September 8, 2022

The meeting opened at 10:15 am at Pardini's Restaurant. BEC officers present were Big Sir Stuart Poytress, Little Sir Rich Glover, Treasurer Brian Nicholson, Assistant Treasurer Steve Chase, Assistant Secretary Brett Bayley, and Secretary Robert Scott. Directors present were Javier Rodriguez (2023), Pete Openshaw (2023), and Jerry Brady (2024). Stuart Poytress proclaimed a quorum was present (9 of 12).

Next, a review of the August 11, 2022 meeting minutes was conducted. Steve Chase moved that the minutes be approved, and Brian Nicholson seconded the motion. The minutes were approved unanimously.

It was reported that "callers" had submitted their reports, and we have ordered 96 lunches for today's meeting. Also, Pete Openshaw is in need of an additional caller.

Rich Glover, our Little SIR, announced that today's program will be presented by Jim Patterson our assemblyman in the state assembly. Our speaker is expected to present information about current events.

Next, the Monthly Cash Report (Form 28) was reviewed. Treasurer Brian Nicholson reported the financial activities during August 2022 were minimal and noted that our luncheon income actually exceed our luncheon expenses. Consequently, our cash balance at the end of August 2022 was 11,976.46. Steve Chase moved that the report be approved, and Richard Glover seconded the motion. The report received unanimous approval.

In regard to membership information, the reports indicated we will be having our 329th meeting today, and we presently have 187 members. Steve Chase moved and Jerry Brady seconded the motion that both membership reports be approved as sent. There was unanimous approval.

#### **September 8, 2022**

The first old business item involved our meeting location for February, March, and April of 2023. Because Pardini's will be remodeling during those months, Stuart Poytress and Bruce Corwin have contacted many locations that could meet our needs. There being no other business, the meeting was adjourned at 10:40 am.
