#### SIR Minutes of Branch 159 Executive Committee

### July 10, 2025

The meeting opened at 10:15 am at Pardini's Restaurant. BEC officers present were Big Sir Mike Parker, Little Sir Duke Marshall, Treasurer Bruce Corwin, Assistant Treasurer Keith Lovgren, Assistant Secretary Brett Bayley, and Secretary Robert Scott. Directors present were Robert Ying (2025), Butch Evans (2026), Pete Openshaw (2026), and John Briceno (2027). Robert Scott proclaimed a quorum was present (10 of 12), and Big Sir Mike Parker opened the meeting.

Next, a review of the June 2025 meeting minutes was conducted. Bruce Corwin moved that the minutes be accepted, and Brett Bayley seconded the motion. The minutes were approved. Based upon inquiries during the calls to members, we found 99 members who stated that they were planning to attend our luncheon today. Bruce Corwin ordered 90 lunches from Pardini's.

Then, our Caller Coordinator reported that we had some members with medical issues. This led to BEC members addressing the need to reinvigorate our Sunshine Committee. To resolve this situation, John Briceno volunteered to chair the committee and begin contacting members when needed.

Little Sir Duke Marshall then announced that Sean Harvey will be the speaker at our luncheon today. Sean is the son of our member Terry Byrne. He will be presenting information about crypto currency and Bitcoin.

Next, the June 2025 Monthly Cash Report (Form 28) was reviewed. Bruce Corwin reported the General Account experienced a \$104 increase primarily from our 50/50 drawing. The netcustodial amount was an increase of \$105 because luncheon income exceeded luncheon expenses. Therefore, at the end of June, there was a cash balance of \$10,876.14. Brett Bayley moved that the report be accepted, and Butch Evans seconded the motion. There was unanimous approval.

The following agenda item concerned the membership reports. Brett Bayley explained that today would be the 363rd meeting of SIR Branch 159. He stated during June we inducted two new members while losing none. Therefore, at the end of June, we had 177 members. The report also indicated that 5 new applicants would be accepted for membership at the approval of the Membership Report. The Form 27 report indicated that 48% of our membership attended our June luncheon, and we had four guests. Bruce Corwin moved that the membership reports be approved, and Keith Lovgren seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

At the conclusion of the discussion about the membership reports, it was reported that a few of our new members had not paid the membership assessment of \$25. Our Big Sir will contact the sponsors of these new members to rectify this situation. It was indicated that the payment from new members joining us from September through the end of each year would include the following year.

The only old business topic concerned the status of our KVPR advertising program. The ad was published for two months for a total cost of \$1,200. At this time, we are not aware of any new members that came to us through the advertisement. It was then suggested that we consider increasing our use of social media to find new members. Keith Lovgren volunteered to pursue how we might focus our Facetime activities.

The first new business item involved the Lifetime Achievement Awards for members who have reached the age of 90 and 95. It was reported that the awards are prepared and ready for distribution at our luncheon.

The second new business item involved the Nominating Committee Report. The committee has identified a slate of officers and directors for 2026. In addition, the Membership Chairman will become a member of the Branch Executive Committee. The slate will be presented to our Branch 159 members at our August meeting.




