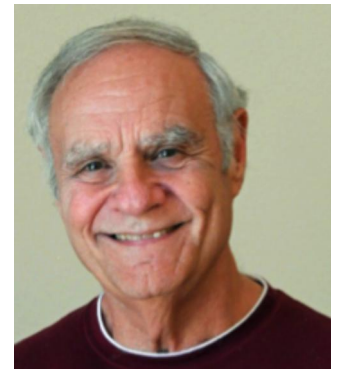

BRANCH REGULATIONS

Thanks to **John Schick**, past Secretary for SIR 171 for many many years, and currently serving as a Director, for all the contributions to the Club over the years. John has done so many things in support of our club that this newsletter would double in size to mention them. One focus area for John has been our **Branch Regulations**. Our Branch 171 Executive Committee (BEC) has recently reviewed and updated our **Branch Regulations** in response to actions approved by the BEC.

Please read the following article from John for a better understanding of our Branch's operations. Anyone wishing to see these regulations is welcome to do so; just ask any of the Branch Officers

HAVE YOU EVER WONDERED WHAT GUIDES A SIR BRANCH, AND SPECIFICALLY OUR BRANCH, IN FUNCTIONING SMOOTHLY AND EFFICIENTLY YEAR AFTER YEAR UNDER A SUCCESSION OF ADMINISTATIONS?

THERE ARE TWO MAIN DOCUMENTS THAT PROVIDE THIS GUIDANCE. ONE IS THE **STATE SIR MANUAL**, WHICH CONTAINS THE RULES AND REQUIREMENTS THAT ALL BRANCHES ARE EXPECTED TO FOLLOW. THESE RULES SPECIFY HOW BRANCHES ARE ORGANIZED, WHAT ARE THE REQUIREMENTS FOR INDIVIDUAL MEMBERSHIP, WHAT ARE THE DUTIES OF BRANCH OFFICERS, WHAT FORMS AND REPORTS MUST BE PROVIDED TO THE STATE AND OTHER OFFICIALS, AND OTHER MATTERS PERTAINING TO BEING DESIGNATED AS A NON-PROFIT ORGANIZATION UNDER IRS RULES.

HOWEVER, THE STATE SIR MANUAL ALSO ALLOWS FOR DISCRETION IN BRANCH OPERATIONS TO MEET EACH BRANCH'S UNIQUE SITUATION AND GOALS. THIS IS WHERE THE **BRANCH REGULATIONS** DOCUMENTS COME INTO PLAY. BRANCH REGULATIONS ADDRESSES TOPICS SUCH AS:

- BRANCH ADMINISTRATION AND LEADERSHIP
- BRANCH COMMUNICATIONS
- BRANCH FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT
- SCHEDULE OF MEETINGS AND LUNCHEONS
- LUNCHEON MEETING AGENDA
- LUNCHEON CHARGES, INCLUDING FREE LUNCH DRAWINGS
- MEMBER STATUS

AN IMPORTANT FUNCTION OF BRANCH REGULATIONS IS TO PROVIDE A FRAMEWORK FOR INCOMING BRANCH LEADERSHIP, GIVING GUIDANCE TO NEW OFFICERS ON HOW BRANCH AFFAIRS ARE CONDUCTED. BRANCH REGULATIONS ARE FLEXIBLE AND ARE PERIODICALLY UPDATED TO REFLECT CURRENT CONDITIONS AND BRANCH NEEDS.
