

### BIG SIR MESSAGE: BARRY LESKIN

My Fellow SIR 171 Members,

A reminder that the election for members of the SIR Branch 2019 Branch Executive Committee (BEC) officers and directors will be held at our August 1 meeting. Please review the election details and procedures, the list of members on the BEC slate, and the names of those members continuing on the Board in the "2019 Elections" article on page 2 of this newsletter.

I am happy to write that Graig Crossley is doing well from his recent medical procedure, but has submitted his resignation as Little SIR in order to focus on his health. The BEC continues to be concerned about the number of meeting sign outs and no shows at our luncheon meetings. The past three months we have had 63%, 63%, and 65% of our members attend, an average of 95 members per meeting. Way below the 75% average we had the prior six months. This is costing all of us money since we have a luncheon commitment with our vendor based on prior attendance percentages. Our assumption is that early and extended summer travel may be the main cause of the decreased lunch attendance. I ask again to contact me with suggestions and ideas in this area.

### LITTLE SIR MESSAGE: RICK FEND

The speaker at our August 1 meeting will be **Dave** Winnacker – Fire Chief, Moraga-Orinda Fire District (MOFD).

Chief Winnacker will discuss MOFD's current fire safety and community risk reduction efforts and his fire service career.



Chief Winnacker is the sixth fire chief in the history of the MOFD and was chosen unanimously in November 2017 by the District board members. He joined the District from the Alameda County Fire Department, where he was Division Chief of Special Operations.

He is a 23-year Marine Corps veteran, and a reservist since 2001, and has worked in fire service for 13 years. He was raised in Berkeley and graduated from UC Santa Barbara.


