My Fellow SIR 171 Members,

The 2019 Branch Executive Committee slate was approved at the August 1 BEC and General Membership meetings. I will continue as Big SIR and Rick Fend will be the Little SIR for 2019. 2018 Little SIR Graig Crossley's unfortunate illness necessitated the succession change. I am very happy to report that Graig is recovering very well. Also approved were new Directors Chris Lynne and Gary Yancey for 3 year terms.

Branch 174 has proposed and our BEC has approved exploring the possibility of a joint SIRS Luncheon in 2019, possibly July 10. The Big SIRs and Little SIRs of both Branches are meeting to develop a proposal. Interestingly, this addresses one of SIR Vice President Ed Benson's goals -- more collaboration between the Branches.

We continue to have a concern that our summer lunch attendance is below our commitment (118) to our food provider. I have been told all branches experience low attendance the 2nd and 3rd quarter and that our percentage attendance is similar to other Branches. Obviously, we will monitor this through the Fall and see if we need to address minimum commitments with our caterer for next year. The past few months we have drawn funds from our budget to cover the shortfall. Our funds are solid, but we need to focus on this expenditure area.

I attended the SIRs National Conference at Thunder Valley in Roseville on August 7. We have a new and very proactive and creative 2018 Vice President, Ed Benson, who has set ambitious goals for 2019 when he will be the SIR State President. I mentioned Prese and creative and cre



ATTENDANCE REPORT: FRANCIS WONG

There were 102 attendees at the last meeting, which included 96 members, one speaker, and five guests (two were repeats). There were 15 no-shows (the highest number since January) and 37 excused sign-outs. 65% of our membership attended. Our guarantee was 118, which was 16 over our actual attendance.

Many of the excused absences and no-shows have not met the requirement to attend six of every twelve meetings, as per the policy below. - It is with deep sadness that SIR Ted Westphal passed away July 17th. A wonderful and dedicated man who made a
 very positive impact on many of our lives and contributed to our SIR's group in so many ways. He joined Branch 171
 in 1995, two years after the formation, and is a life member of SIRs. A private celebration of his life will be held on
 Sept. 1st. His obituary was mailed to all members a few weeks ago.
- It is very sad to report the passing of SIR John Mossman on July 17th. He joined SIRs in 2001 and was placed on our Inactive Roster in April 2018 due to poor health. In recent years John was very active in the SIR 171/174 Apple User Group, rarely missing a meeting.

John was born in Port Arthur, Texas to Roy and Hattie Mossman. He graduated from East High School in Denver, Colorado and served in the U.S. Army Air Corps during World War II, in the China-Burma-India Theater. John graduated from Denver University with a degree in Chemical Engineering, where he was a member of Delta Chi (the local men's honorary chemical fraternity) and served as president of the DU student chapter of the American Institute of Chemical Engineers. He went on to earn a subsequent Masters Degree from M.I.T.

He worked for 40 years as a Petrochemical Engineer with Oriental Refinery, Bechtel Corporation, and Chevron. His work took him around the world to many exotic locations, including Indonesia, Korea, Libya, Abu Dhabi, and Algeria. John was truly an engineer throughout his life, completing many "DIY" projects, including the unassisted planning and construction of a deck at his home.

He was a lifetime learner, participating in Elder Hostel and other educational programs throughout the world. John is survived by his loving wife of 67 years, Juanita Caddy Mossman; sister Nancy; daughters Jan Mahumed and Judy (Robert) Brown; grandsons Todd and Jack Brown. John enjoyed a long, rich life and will be missed by many.

A Memorial Service for John will be on Sat. Sept.1st at 11:00 am at Hulls Walnut Creek Chapel, 1139 Saranap Ave., Walnut Creek. The family has asked if our SIR Chaplain, Tom Marnane, will say a few words at the Memorial Service. Tom plans to be at the service. In lieu of flowers, the family requests donations to a charity of their choice.

SIR Warren Ehrhardt was hospitalized and is recovering at Manor Care, Walnut Creek.

SIR Jerry Borrmann is recovering from an heart attack.

• We were deeply saddened to hear of the passing of past **Big SIR Dan Cawthon**. Dan had transferred to inactive status last October due to declining health.

Dan was Branch 174's first guest speaker when he entertained our members with his rendering of the one man drama of the life of Father Damien de Veuster, a Belgian missionary priest, recounting the priest's years spent at the Leper Settlement on Molokai where, as a new priest with only four years of religious training, he won the hearts of his parishioners at Puna and Kohala.

Dan had been a member of the faculty at Saint Mary's College where he was instrumental in establishing the Performing Arts Department, which he chaired for 15 years. He taught courses in acting, theatre history and criticism and directed dozens of student productions.

Dan was a member of Actors' Equity Association. He performed at the Berkeley Repertory Theatre, the San Jose Repertory Theatre, the California (Berkeley) Shakespeare Festival, and other theatres in the Bay Area. He first performed Damien at the Berkeley Stage Company and toured the production extensively in the United States and Europe for several years, culminating in a two-week run at the Edinburgh Festival Fringe.

He was the Artistic Director for Playwrights' Theatre at the Eugene O'Neill Foundation, Tao House (in Danville, California). Among the many productions he directed at the Foundation was O'Neill: The Rhythms of His Soul, a musical revue he wrote which includes over seventy songs imbedded in O'Neill's plays.

Upon graduation, he joined Dodge & Cox as a securities analyst. The balance of his career was with the investment counseling firm, Bailard, Biehl & Kaiser, where he managed families' finances.

Sev's initial marriage did not work out, but produced three wonderful children, Linsay, Brooks and Thatcher, all Miramonte graduates. In 1990, Sev married Margie Handal of Lafayette. That added three step-children, Ali, Jennifer, and Sarah, to his extended family. He now has four grandchildren and five step-grandchildren.

Sev's primary outside interests include fly-fishing and history-based travel. He also enjoys classes at the local colleges and universities and model railroading.


There are two upcoming outings – visiting the Eugene O'Neill house in Danville and taking a cruise on President Franklin Roosevelt's USS Potomac.
