




The Sirs State organization has changed some rules and procedures to make us more efficient and more flexible as we seek to retain existing members and add new ones. A major change is to drop the term "Inactive" for member reporting, which includes those members who do not meet luncheon attendance guidelines, and allow each Branch to decide their own guidelines. There are various considerations, including the insurance coverage for Inactive members that attend a meeting or participate in activities. There are some options for addressing this, including dues, which many branches have adopted. This area, and the various considerations, will be covered at the January BEC meeting.

We have renegotiated our guarantee for luncheon meals with our caterer. We had been guaranteeing 118 per luncheon meeting, but had been losing money most recent months since our actual luncheon attendance was about 104 to 106. The new guarantee for 2019 will be for 110 persons, so please make every effort to attend the meetings so we can meet or exceed that number.


BOCCE BALL: STEVE PATTON Br. 171 ED PROTIVA (Br. 174)
