

# **BIG SIR MESSAGE: BARRY LESKIN**

My Fellow SIR 171 Members,

As we continue to promote SIR to outsiders, our greatest source of new members comes from existing members. A special thanks to those members that have invited guests to our luncheon meetings. We had 8 guests the past three months. Keep up the invites.

We completed a brief survey at our April luncheon. The survey is similar to one that has been conducted at other branches. I thank the 56 members that completed the survey. Some key findings (*note: some questions were not answered by all, thus not 100% for each question*):

- 40% would like more co-ed activities; 21% would not want more.
- 34% have been volunteers for Branch positions; 50% have not.
- 34% have sponsored new members the last 2 years; 29% have not.
- 90% indicated they read our Branch 171 Newsletter.
- No strong preference for changing Branch size: 40% want size at 100-150 members; 29% would like size 150-200 members; 8% would like size to be 200+
- In response to "what you most like about SIR" 60% like the camaraderie, social interaction and people relationships.




# **SIRPREMES in ACTION**
