



Mr. Nasief's experience as a healthcare leader spans over four decades, including positions at John Muir Health (2007 to the present), Kaiser Permanente, California Pacific Medical Center, and Children's Hospital in Los Angeles.

Some recent accomplishments include:

- Stewarding the operations-led implementation of EPIC, a fully-integrated Electronic Health Record (EHR) and Revenue Cycle system
- Spearheading the occupancy of the \$612 million expansion of the John Muir Medical Center in Walnut Creek (JMMCWC).
- Occupancy of the new Hoffman Tower on the Concord Campus
- Streamlining operations and leading multiple change management activities

Mr. Nasief has administrative responsible for Facilities Management and Ancillary Services, and is the Liaison to Facilities Development, Safety and Emergency Management, and New Building/Transition Planning for three Medical Centers and the Corporate Offices.




