

 - Submitting a chat
 - Muting and unmuting yourself

SIR Larry Swindell passed away on June 22.

Larry joined SIR in 2007 and resigned for health reasons in 2018. He was a member of both 171 and 174, was very active in the bridge group, and was a speaker at our meetings on occasions. One program revolved on his knowledge of the film industry and his personal involvement with some of the stars.

Larry was a journalist for over 45 years, taught composition and literature at five universities, and published a number of biographies on Hollywood celebrities. So well known in the Local Community as a member of SIR, the Kiwanis Club of Moraga Valley, Lamorinda Movers, and as a member of the Moraga Park Commission and Moraga Historical Society. He was inducted both into the Texas Literary Hall of Fame and the Classic Film Hall of Fame in Moraga, and is remembered for his unbelievable facilitation of monthly classic movies at the Rheem Theater.

Larry knew everything on baseball, the movies, and history. He could not be stumped. A treasure for the local community and a wonderful man. A very talented and versatile (yet humble) man.
