I attended the State SIR meeting (not in Napa as originally planned) but via Zoom. Among other State business they shared some of the statistics from the July survey you all were emailed. 45% of you responded. I just received the stats on the Branch level and would like to share a few of the highlights:

- What makes SIR membership of interest to you? #1 was the luncheons. #2 was the variety of activities. Our hope is that the Zoom meetings are somewhat filling the gap for #1 and that we can continue to open more activities to address #2.
- Rate the activities according to how frequently you participate. Cards and Computers scored highest, followed by Dining Out, Bocce and then Golf. *I'm surprised Walking didn't make the list.*
- How do you rate your SIR experience? 77% very enjoyable; 17% OK; 3% Love it; 3% take it or leave it.

Are you familiar with the SIR four expectations of its members? Yes - 32%; No - 30%; Not sure -38%. FYI, the four expectations are -- (1) be a friendly and sociable guy; (2) participate in our activities, luncheons and events; (3) volunteer when asked; (4) bring guests to perpetuate our Branch.

Additionally, the guest question was followed with - "are you willing to devote effort to increase SIR membership?" 42% indicated Yes, 22% indicated No, and 46% indicated I'm not sure.



Candace was first elected to the Contra Costa County Board of Supervisors in June 2012. In June 2016 and March 2020 she ran unopposed and was re-elected to four-year terms. She plans to run again in 2024.



In her role as County Supervisor Candace currently sits on 29 local and regional boards and commissions addressing planning and land use, transportation, pensions, mental health, healthcare, reuse, and recycling, economic development and public safety. 

ACTIVITIES CHAIRMAN: DAVID ZEIMER (BR. 171)



The Activity Chairman's role is to support the various chairmen of our branch activities, provide liaison with those chairmen and the Branch Executive Committee, and to assist in organizing new activities of interest to our branch members. The Chair is the focal point to communicate with if you would like to chair any of the open activity groups.

There is a formal process SIR leadership has put in place for the re-opening of activities. Each of our activities fall into one or more of the following four categories:

- 1. Some activities have re-opened and meeting in-person and/or on Zoom
- 2. Some activities have not formally re-opened, but are meeting via Zoom
- 3. Some activity re-openings are in process (may include activities in category 2 above)
- 4. Some activities are not meeting via Zoom and have not yet initiated the paperwork to get the formal approvals, many because there is no practical way for the group to meet at this time. However, Zoom is a good way to keep in touch with other members of the group.

If you are a member of an activity that has not yet re-opened in some form, please contact your Activity Chair with suggestions and encouragement or for a way for the group to meet.

Those activities that fall into categories 1 & 2 are included in the following portion of the newsletter.

1. ACTIVITES THAT HAVE FORMALLY RE-OPENED

FISHING: KARL DROESE (Br. 171) RON LEW (Area 16)



All SIR members and guests are welcome and encouraged to participate in fishing trips as well as attend the monthly meetings. Our next ZOOM meeting is scheduled for Thursday, October 22, starting at 8:30 am.

Whether you fly fish, spin fish, troll, or bait fish there will be events of interest. If you are new to fishing or are interested in trying a different type of fishing we have experienced and knowledgeable members happy to share their expertise, and even their equipment. With over 100 events scheduled throughout the year, some type of fishing is available almost every week.

September results: A dozen members booked rockfish/lingcod trips on a party boat (limited to half the normal load of passengers in order to comply with COVID

distance requirements) and brought back limits including a lingcod weighing nearly 50 lbs. Others fished for halibut and salmon in member boats. Four members were successful catching striped and black bass in the Delta.

Activities Scheduled for October and November: As the salmon season winds down our ocean fishermen are focusing on rock fish with several trips outside the Gate on member boats and party boats. Some are looking forward to the opening of the crab season in November. The salmon are now on their way up the rivers to spawn and the fall run of striped bass has started. Other activities include shark/potluck trips in member boats on the Bay; a pier fishing potluck; trout and catfish fishing on San Pablo Reservoir and trout fishing at Shadow Cliffs; a BBQ (conditions permitting); a guided trip on Lake Almanor and Eagle Lake (conditions permitting) and fly fishing, spin fishing and trolling at Pyramid Lake NV for cutthroat trout (conditions permitting).
