The speaker will be **Dr. Michael Baker**, semi-retired general and trauma surgeon who served his country in uniform for 30 years. In his role as a Navy officer, he had experience in operational medicine, combat deployments, medical intelligence, and strategic planning. He retired with the rank of rear admiral.

At our meeting Dr. Baker will speak on the following topic:

"The Future of Warfare"

Dr. Michael Baker received his medical degree from Pennsylvania State University in Hershey, PA. He completed his residency in general surgery at the US Public Health Service Hospital in San Francisco and completed a cardiovascular fellowship at Baylor College of Medicine in Houston, TX. He is board certified in General Surgery and a fellow of the American College of Surgeons. He has extensive training in laparoscopic and minimally invasive surgery as well as complex surgery for trauma. Dr. Baker is a retired U.S. Navy Rear Admiral and served for more than 20 years as Chair of the Department of Surgery at multiple East Bay Medical Centers. He is a respected lecturer with the Osher Lifelong Learning Institute (OLLI.)

Harold was into many sports and loved to chase that elusive, little, white ball around with a stick (aka "golf"). He was an avid traveler and was an active member of the local Kiwanis chapter, where he served as President in 2004.

We are sad to report the passing of **Sir Todd Royster**, who was inducted into Sir 171 in January 2018. He passed away on November 24 and was 83 years old.

Todd was born in St. Louis, Missouri, and his dad was a Marine on Iwo Jima. He attended Henry Ford College and then completed studies at the University of New Mexico. He was later assigned to the Army Security Agency to work alongside the NSA in Germany. After completing his service Todd moved to Hollywood. He thought of a career in the CIA, but got a job as an insurance investigator. Then took a position as District Marketing Manager for an insurance company, which required a transfer to the Bay Area. He moved to Berkeley and later to Orinda. Todd is survived by his wife Nancy.
