



This made the morning fishing really difficult, as the fish had been gorging themselves on new bugs hatched that night. Anyway, we were rewarded with 17 beautiful trout (browns and rainbows) in the 1+ pound to 4 pound sizes. This time the bait shop was right, in that we asked for and used the "hot lure" they recommended and **Bill Hooy** alone took home 6 prime trout. The others made sporadic catches and all boats confirmed catching fish. Otherwise, the accommodations (PG&E Camp) were good and the food excellent. **Richard Bal** pursued a "healthy menu", which included lots of fruits and veggies. Large roaring campfire at night (in the fire ring at the Camp) added to great fun for all. We'll be back.

Area 2 Fishing Social was June 15th at Mr. Pickwick's Pub on Clayton Road in Concord. Attendees were 29, including spouses. Darts, fish and chips, bangers and mash made for a great evening. There were even some "awards" to recognize special achievements. Another fun evening.

Branch 8's **Tom Hensley** is continuing our "Newbie" program (for members, who haven't fished for some time or even ever and who want to try it) by taking members or members-in-waiting out for a full day of fishing. Tom supplies all the gear, the bait and the boat. No takers this month. You're missing a great time together, and, after all, that's what it's all about. We've had trouble getting the planned McAvoy/Ryer Island Delta striper fishing trips out, because of high water, wind, debris and muddy water. The Shad trip for the American River also was cancelled because of these same factors. Favorable conditions have to come soon. Branch 8's **Bob Kahl** reported on his catch-and-release fly fishing in the mountains of Peru. The fish were awesome and weather perfect. Cost was big but that's part of it all. He'll go again.

Much more is planned, but this summarizes the next 3 or so months.
