In order for us to reopen, we need to get fully vaccinated. I know there are some out there that will not get the vaccine and that is fine, but if you want to come to a SIRs event indoors you'll have to bring in your COVID 19 vaccination card or a negative COVID test taken within 72 hours. In this issue you will see that there is a waiver, the Sir Event Waiver and Release of Liability for exposure to COVID-19, that you will need to sign to participate in SIRs activities. You will also see the State SIR protocols for attending events which our Branch Executive Committee (BEC) has adopted. So check those items out. Also the BEC has voted to resume the collection of dues. Your dues will be half of the usual amount, which is \$10. The regular amount is \$20, but since we had no activities until now, you only need to pay \$10 which is due June 1. If you do not pay by August 1 you cannot participate in any SIR activity. We have expenses we need to cover which includes our quarterly insurance assessment and various incidentals. So please send your \$10 check to our Treasurer, Tim Anglim, 310 Leveland Lane, Modesto, 95350. Make it out to SIRs Branch 103.

Muni-Creekside Golf

Muni-Creekside Golf is an activity that was created by Bob Kredit and Don Reed. This is **not** a SIR sponsored event. This is a weekly event held at Creekside Golf Course on Thursday mornings. Tee times are first come, first serve, and requests must be made by email or message to Bob Kredit at 12:00 am the Thursday previous to the golf tee time. You must have a tee time before coming to the course. Masks are required inside the building and recommended while on the course. Each player must check-in with Bob inside or outside the Grill before checking in with the course. Each player will have their temperature recorded by Bob at check-in. Temps over 100.4 will not play. Bob will also collect your \$3.00. Course rules are in effect. Do not touch the flag. 2 players are allowed to ride in the same cart. No rakes in the bunkers. No 5somes are allowed. At the end of 9 holes, you must turn in your card to Don inside or outside the Grill with 2 signatures. If you play 18, keep a separate card for the back nine. You are responsible to post your own back nine score. Closest To The Hole will be #8. Hand sanitizer and wipes will be in the bag. Do not handle the equipment unless you are on the green. There will not be a common pencil provided. Use your own. There will be no gathering, and prize pay-outs will be the next time we see you. As for play, we can have 48 players with 12 tee times thanks to Larry for working with us.l

State SIR has established protocols for minimizing COVID-19 liabilities for the branches. SIR Branch 103 BEC adopted these protocols in April. The most important of these rules, which will affect all branch members and their spouses/significant others, is the requirement of being fully vaccinated in order to attend or participate in any activity which is conducted wholly or partially indoors, or possess a negative COVID-19 test administered with 72 hours prior to any activity. A copy of the vaccination record card, or test results documentation will have to be provided. All attendees in any SIR activity will be required to sign a waiver prior to participation in the activity. These protocols were created to protect the health and safety of all members and minimize SIR's liability to claims related to pandemic diseases. The State Protocols and Branch Protocols for Minimizing COVID-19 Liability, and the SIR Event Waiver are included in the following pages.

BRANCH PROTOCOLS FOR MINIMIZING COVID-19 LIABILITY

In view of the deletion by SIR's insurance carrier, effective May 1, 2021, of coverage for pandemic diseases and the likelihood that other carriers are also not providing such coverage, the following requirements are necessary to protect the health and safety of SIR members and minimize SIR's exposure to possible claims related to pandemic diseases:

1. The branches are required to strictly observe corporate formalities, such as annual election of officers and keeping corporate minutes in a timely and orderly manner.
2. The branches are urged to encourage all branch members to be vaccinated against COVID-19 and to help those branch members who need assistance in finding vaccination centers and getting vaccinated.
- 3. Beginning May 1, 2021 and until further notice to the contrary, branches shall require branch members, visiting SIR members from other branches, guest speakers, guests, and spouses/significant others ("Attendees") to be fully vaccinated (2 shots, if required) as a condition of being allowed to attend branch activities which are conducted wholly or partially indoors. In the alternative, unvaccinated Attendees can attend such activities if they provide proof of a negative COVID-19 test administered within 3 days prior to an event they want to attend.**
4. To ensure compliance with the requirements of item 3, branches shall require Attendees to show the original, a copy, or photo (in hardcopy or via a phone) of their vaccination record cards or test result documentation. If the attendee does not produce the document previously mentioned, access will be denied.
5. Branches shall maintain an updated list of members who have submitted proof of vaccination and use it to check them in for branch activities involving any indoor components. Branches need not require members who are on the vaccinated list to show proof of vaccination thereafter.
6. Branches shall require all Attendees participating in SIR activities to comply with all then-current state and county requirements related to COVID-19 protection, such as wearing masks and social distancing.
- 7. Branches shall require all Attendees attending SIR indoor or outdoor activities, to execute the attached waiver prior to allowing a member to attend such activities. 6. Branches shall require all Attendees participating in SIR activities to comply with all then-current state and county requirements related to COVID-19 protection, such as wearing masks and social distancing.
7. Branches shall require all Attendees attending SIR indoor or outdoor activities, to execute the attached waiver prior to allowing them to attend such activities. Such waiver need only be executed once by a member, and the branch shall maintain the originals of executed waivers for inspection by State SIR representatives.
8. Branches not complying with the above requirements are subject to appropriate action as provided in the Bylaws.
9. SIR shall build and maintain a reserve of at least \$25,000 to provide loans for legal fees to any branch which is sued for an uninsured matter.
10. If a lawsuit against a branch does arise due to an uninsured claim, and such lawsuit cannot be resolved in a manner acceptable to SIR, SIR can move forward to dissolve the branch in question pursuant to the provisions of California Corp. Code sections 6614-18.

3. Knowing the foregoing risk, the undersigned assumes the risk of Covid-19 exposure and accepts sole responsibility for any exposure to Covid-19 and resulting health conditions that may occur due to attendance at a Branch or State SIR event.
4. The undersigned hereby releases and holds harmless the Branch, State SIR, and their respective officers, directors, and members from any and all responsibility for illness, death, or other losses arising from exposure to Covid-19 at a Branch or State SIR event.

ceive a free lunch. Dennis will look at the State SIR website for something we could use.

Membership: Bob Kredit reported no change in membership; we have 158 members. Bob said he talked to a person who is considering joining our Branch.

Program: Our Apr. speaker was introduced by Bill Hunt and Bill Rusing, Marcus Frost, from the M.I.N.D. Institute associated with UC Davis. This Institute is working on scientific ways to help those with autism and other mental disabilities. He described some of the areas of the research and treatments the Institute is pursuing. It was a fascinating presentation.

Sunshine. Gary Del Nero reported that Bob Kredit had some medical procedures. Jerry Hott is having eye issues. Joe Stackhouse had hand surgery. Earl Glenn is getting better. Bob Palmer had a pacemaker replacement procedure.

Health and Safety: Kerry reported on the Branch 103 survey. 100 members responded. He tried to contact the other 58 members. 40 members said that they would not get vaccinations. He will continue to try to contact the other members. Vaccinations are readily available. SIR Protocols state that members attending meetings will have to show their vaccination card or have a Covid 19 negative test result give within 3 days of the meeting. Kerry also urged members to be careful of the spread of West Nile Disease spread by mosquitoes.

Golf: John Reedy went over the waivers golfers need to sign before being able to participate in our tournaments. He also reminded the Board about signing up for tournaments:

HE MUST HAVE CHECKS BY WEDNESDAY PRIOR TO THE TOURNAMENT. NO CHECKS WILL BE ACCEPTED AT THE TOURNAMENT. NO ONE WILL BE ALLOWED TO JUST SHOW UP AND PLAY. A drop box will be used to put in your scorecards.

Newsletter: Jeff said hopes the members are aware of the new articles that he has published.

Merchandising: Big Sir asked Dennis about the coffee mugs. Dennis reported that he contacted 4 firms and has gotten information. They can do the mugs. He asked what we wanted on the mugs. After a prolonged discussion, a motion came. Motion: the mugs will have the new SIR logo on one side facing right handers, and the old SIR logo on the other- Chin 2nd Rowe- PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

Dennis also has sold 3 hats and needs to buy more.

Data Processing: Richard would like someone to take over as web master.

Travel: Bill presented the travel protocols. Motion: approve the travel protocols-Rowe, 2nd Barnard- PASSED UNANIMOUSLY. Bill said the Laguna Arts festival is still on. Other trips are tentatively planned for 2021-22.

Old Business: 1. Doug opened the discussion on how we should open up meetings. The State SIR Chat found that 98% of the Big Sirs want their members to be vaccinated to attend meetings. The Board discussed the opening. Motion: Follow the State SIR Protocols for Branch openings. Among the Protocols are that each member must have proof of vaccination, or a Covid 19 negative test result given within 3 days of the meeting (Check the next Newsletter for fuller details) Chin, 2nd Rowe- PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

2. Doug also brought up the topic of dues. After a discussion, the following MOTION was made: Dues will be collected starting June 1 through August for the prorated rate of \$10. Checks will be sent to Treasurer Tim Anglim: Reed 2nd Newman- PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

3. Tim is going to research for methods to collect lunch money by credit card.
