ALL ABOUT ME

Branch 103 has 109 members. A member will be chosen to tell all about themselves. Big Sir Dick Nelson will interview members each month. The member who Dick interviewed this month is Don Reed.

My story starts in Portales, New Mexico, January 13, 1935.

For the next six years my folks lived in a number of states, including NM, Texas, Oklahoma and Arizona. My father was a heavy equipment operator. Never did I spend a year in one school, until we came to California just after the start of WWII. He belonged to Local 3 of the Operating Engineers Union for 50 years. After we had been at Honey Lake, CA, building ammunition storage units in the high desert, we ended up in Oakland. My dad was working at Hunter's Point in San Francisco, when I was infected by spinal meningitis and was in a coma for 21 days in county hospital (in quarantine). The Good Lord must have seen something good in me and have now lived to be 88 years of age.

My Reed family has a long history in America, even before the Revolutionary War. My great, great, great grandparent fought in that war and my great, great grandfather and great grandfather were in the Civil War, where the son lost his leg at age 20. He lived to be only 72 and fathered 11 children. The Reeds moved from North Carolina after the Civil War and moved to Texas, taking two years by wagon train. Had great uncles in WWI and older brother who was in the Navy Sea Bees during WWII. Younger brother was in US Air Force 23 years, serving in Vietnam 3 tours. I had joined the California National Guard while in HS and spent 6 years plus three more in the Army Reserve. Attained the rank of Staff Sgt. when discharged. Was platoon sergeant in communications at Modesto Headquarters Company 184th Infantry, California 49th Division of the National Guard. We moved to Modesto when was in the 8th grade, went to Modesto High School, where I learned the printing trade. Worked at Gowans Printing during my senior year and time at MJC. Kept moving around several print shops until landed at The Modesto Bee. Have been a member of International Typographical Union, now CWA for 64 years. Served as Sec.-Treas. In Modesto and a short stent, same position, when we merged with the Sacramento Local 46 Union. Was the Allied Printing Trades Council Sec.-Treas. for over 40 years here in Stanislaus County. During my moves I met my wife, Mable, while working at the Los Banos Enterprise weekly newspaper. We married May 21, 1955 in Las Vegas, Nevada. We would have been married for 68 years this year. Mable was taken from me on November 26, 2022 after a long illness.

We have two sons, four grandchildren and seven great grandchildren.

While our boys were young, was active in Bel Passi Baseball for Boys. Served several years as the president. Also, during this time, spent 9 years in the Modesto Police Reserve. All this time was enjoying the great game of bowling. Started league bowling in 1951 at the old Modesto Bowl. Moved to McHenry in 1959 when it first opened. Spent 39 years as Secretary-Treasurer of the Tuesday El Dorado League. Retired and became a SIR bowler Tuesday afternoons with Branch 103 during the year 1997.

Was a member of the Branch Executive Committee or something for over 24 years. Was editor of the branch newsletter "The Town Crower" for over 15 years. Took over the responsibility for the Thursday SIR golf at Muni in 2000 when it almost went defunct. Did it alone until Bob Kredit came along about 2009-10 and asked if needed help. The rest is history. Became a Honorary Life Member in 2010. Was upgraded to a Senior Honorary Life Member in 2020. Almost the longest serving member of SIR Branch 103. Only Ed Davis and Lon Loudermilk have been a member longer.
