I have known Mark Lim for several years. He is soft spoken and serious. We have often laughed about his experiments with new golf equipment. Mark attempted to start a Chinese takeout restaurant which failed. He was a black jack dealer at a Trump casino in Atlantic City for 15 years. "It was boring, all I did was count cards."


