Alzheimer's Disease - July Program

Alzheimer's disease, a type of dementia, is an irreversible, progressive brain disease that affects an estimated 5.7 million Americans. It is the sixth leading cause of death among all adults and the fifth leading cause for those aged 65 or older.

The causes of Alzheimer's disease and other dementias are not completely understood, but researchers believe they include a combination of genetic, environmental, and lifestyle factors. In more than 90% of people with Alzheimer's, symptoms do not appear until after age 60. The incidence of the disease increases with age and doubles every 5 years beyond age 65. Working to ensure that caregivers have the resources to provide quality care to people with dementia.

ALL ABOUT ME

Branch 103 has 115 members. A member will be chosen to tell all about themselves. Big Sir Dick Nelson will interview members each month. The member who Dick interviewed this month is Coe Barnard.

Coe Barnard was born in the first aid office of a sawmill in the company town of Kienzua, Oregon, which no longer exists. His Dad walked on logs and directed them to a chain which dragged them out of the water. His parents were paid in chits, which were only redeemed at a company store. When Coe was six, his parents decided that they did not want him going to a one-room school house and moved to Hood River. Coe graduated from high school in 1957. He played football, and basketball. "My graduating class had 39 people in it."

"I had always hunted with my Dad for deer and ducks. I started competing in shooting matches in high school. I went to Oregon State and wanted to be a chemist, but chemistry did not like me. I was walking around campus and passed the Food Science and Technology Building. I met the Dean and asked him what Food Science was and changed my major. Meanwhile, I was in NROTC which paid for my books and tuition, and shot in competitive meets throughout college." Coe continued his shooting career while on active duty as a member of the U.S. Navy Rifle Team which shot all over the world. "I always wanted to go to the Olympics." Coe participated in the Pan American Games held in Cairo in 1961 and lost to a Russian. "He was a better shot than me," Coe acknowledged. Coe served primarily in the Far East on the York Town as an officer on the hangar deck.

After completing his active duty, Coe went to work for a food company, "Stange," which made bulk spice blends for food processors like Frito Lay, Kentucky Fried Chicken, and Tri-Valley, Stanislaus Foods. Coe met his wife, Ruth, a hospital dietician, who lived in the same apartment building in Oakland. They moved to Modesto in 1992. Coe's company was sold to McCormick Spice, and then Newly Wed Food. He retired when he was 64.

Coe and Ruth had two girls and a son who works with the food service for Boulder, Colorado Schools as well as being a sous chef for a catering company. Coe joined Sirs in 2006 with Kerry Newman when invited by a friend at the SOS Club. Coe's main interests are golf, cooking, and gardening. "I really like to barbecue." One last note when asked about an interesting item, Coe mentioned," Our most memorable trip was to China on a Viking cruise to Beijing, and Wuhan in the fall of 2019."


