# **ALL ABOUT ME**

Branch 103 has 104 members. A member will be chosen to tell all about themselves. Dick Nelson will interview members each month. The member who Dick interviewed Ed Guida.

Ed Guida lives in Oakdale. "I got tired of making the left hand turn on 120 heading up Sonora." I'd come over from the Bay area to go fishing up at Pinecrest and just decided. Hey, I am truck driver, I can get a job anyplace,, so why not live in Oakdale. So I bought my house in Oakdale and moved there twenty five years ago.

My Dad was a realtor in Redwood City. He told me, 'If you have something you're good at, you'll never be out of work.' I went to Sequoia High School in Redwood City. My main interests were football and girls. I was a 145 pound linebacker with one speed ... fast. Coaches held me out of practice because I hit the starters too hard. I had enough credits to graduate my junior year. I worked part time jobs at Portola State Park and at a gas station. I was making grown-up money, so I had money for dates. I'd go into the city during the Summer of Love in 1968.

I went to the College of San Mateo for a semester taking some aeronautical mechanics classes. I was better with a pencil than a wrench.

The Army was a good experience from 1973-1976. After basic at Fort Polk, I had a two month delay before my AIT at MP School at Fort Gordon. During this delay I was assigned to a range where I shot every firearm the Army had. I got really good with the M-14. I liked to drive. so I drove trucks for almost 40 years, starting out making deliveries in Bobtails and then full sized trailers in the Bay Area. My last 5 years, I was the Safety Manager for Gardner Trucking.

I met my wife Pam at Moniz Sausage Company in Oakland. We have 4 kids, 6 grandkids, and two great-grand children.

Ed has a part time job at Bass Pro in the camping department. In his spare time, he reads James Patterson novels, golfs, gardens, camps and fishes. "I walk the stream banks up at Dardanelles, Clark's Fork, Kennedy Meadows, and either fly fish or bait fish."
