The Area Agency on Aging had a representative speak at our February luncheon. They have created a program to assist older adults, 60 or older, residing in Stanislaus County experiencing symptoms of depression or loss. PEARLS, the Program to Encourage Active Rewarding Lives, have coaches who meet one-on-one with older adults in individual sessions spanning six to eight visits over the course of four to five months. The program begins with weekly meetings that gradually transition to monthly sessions. I grew up in Campbell, the middle child with three brothers. My Dad played semi- pro baseball as a catcher with the San Francisco Seals in the Pacific Coast League for seven years. He never made it to the majors. HIs big dream was to see the San Francisco Giants in the World Series. He died a couple of months before they won their first one in 2010. With a wife and four hungry boys, he worked for IBM as a facilities manager. I went to Westmont High School. I was a catcher on the baseball team, a 180 pound linebacker and guard on the football team.

I met my wife in sixth grade and wanted to get married in high school. Our parents wanted us to go to college. However, after two years at West Valley Junior College, I knew college was not for me. I went to work for my father-in-law, who was a manufacturer's rep to independent hardware stores. With the consolidation of hardware stores by the bigger chains like Orchard and Home Depot, I could see the writing on the wall. I transitioned to selling to the Arts and Crafts people like Michael's and Beverly's throughout California, Nevada, Washington, Oregon. Eventually, I started to import many of the items I sold from China, Viet Nam, Thailand. Every 4th grade kid in California had a mission project. My company provided the trees, figures and much of the material in these projects.

We moved to Modesto in 1980. My parents in Cambell thought we had moved to the end of the earth. Our neighbors here considered us Bay Area Transplants. While traveling throughout the valley, I would often stay at a friend's house in Modesto. We thought Modesto was a much better place to raise a family than East San Jose.

My wife, Joan, and I have two daughters, one is a Marriage and Family Counselor, who works with Wounded Warriors and Project Sanctuary, as well as managing a facility for women heroin addicts. Our other daughter does school placement for military kids.

After driving 25,000—40,000 miles a year I still like to get in the car and travel. I enjoy San Francisco Giant's baseball, Forty-niner football, and golf.

Brian has been a member of Sirs for the last three years, and serves energetically as Assistant Treasurer, and member of the BEC.


