ALL ABOUT ME

Branch 103 has 99 members. A member will be chosen to tell all about themselves. Dick Nelson will interview members each month. The member who Dick interviewed Murle Webb.

Murle Webb is 92 years old, with a birthday coming up in May. He walks a bit slow, but still plays golf. "You make adjustments as you get older. Most people in my family lived a long time." Talk with Murle and you could take an amazing trip from a small chicken ranch in Hollister through the early history of Silicon Valley.

Murle was born in Tulare but only lived there for ten days before moving to San Juan. "December 7 1941, we listened to the radio and heard about Pearl Harbor. We only lived 25 miles from the coast and were afraid the Japanese might invade. I worked on the ranch, built chicken barns, and became the ranch mechanic by the time I graduated from Hollister High School. I had an uncle in the Merchant Marines and another uncle enlisted in the Marines, who survived Iwo Jima and came home after the war. I was an aviation technician in the Navy, stationed at Hickman Air Field in Hawaii, attached to the Military Aviation Transport Service, which flew dignitaries, as well as bringing back wounded and sick on DC 4's.

Murle worked briefly with Sylvania which had no bid contracts with the Army Signal Corps. At Micro Wave Laboratories in Palo Alto, he worked with guidance systems. There had been a multitude of failures with missile launches at Vandenburg because Russians had jammed the guidance system of our rockets.

Murle was in the heyday of electronic transformation. In 1947, William Shockley, with others invented the transistor, which quickly replaced the vacuum tube and greatly enhanced the efficiency of communication of both voice and data. Murle worked for both Micro Wave Technologies and Fairchild Industries and was involved in numerous visits to Cape Canaveral during the Ranger Space Program. Historical Footnote: In 1968, a couple of men, Robert Norse and Gordon Moore left Fairchild and founded Intel which rapidly brought into production the first micro chip. Murle was a research and development guy. "You know in that kind of work there are mostly failures. But there is one thing that I am really proud of something which was eventually used in communication cell towers, made commercially available and used by organizations like the Tennessee Valley Authority and AT&T."

Fairchild Industries was in upheaval and Murle decided to change careers. He headed up the AAA office in Hollister for 15 years, before retiring in 1987 and moving to Modesto in 1989. He is married to Barbara. They have two children and four grand children. He has been a member of Sirs since 1999, has traveled extensively in his retirement, particularly enjoying the national parks. His favorite place, Kodachrome Canyon, Utah.

Murle gave me a history lesson on the amazing impact a small invention and upgrade like how a transistor could be enhanced in design and manufacture leading to transformations of communications, data processing, and the rise of great American companies like Intel. A farm boy from a chicken ranch in Hollister could draw lines on a world map of places where his projects touched:the Black Sea, Arctic Circle, Washington D.C, Tennessee Valley, Canada, Vandenberg, Cape Canaveral.
